1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 65B.472, is amended to read:
1.8	65B.472 TRANSPORTATION NETWORK FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY.
1.9	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) Unless a different meaning is expressly made applicable,
1.10	the terms defined in paragraphs (b) through $\frac{(g)(p)}{(g)}$ have the meanings given them for the
1.11	purposes of this chapter section .
1.12	(b) A "Digital network" means any online-enabled application, software, website, or
1.13	system offered or utilized by a transportation network company that enables the
1.14	prearrangement of rides with transportation network company drivers.
1.15	(c) "Disability and income loss benefits" means compensation for 85 percent of the
1.16	injured person's loss of present and future gross income from inability to work proximately
1.17	caused by the nonfatal personal injury sustained.
1.18	(d) "P1," "P2," and "P3" have the meanings given in section 181C.01, subdivision 4.
1.19	(e) "Funeral and burial expenses" has the meaning given in section 65B.44, subdivision
1.20	<u>4.</u>
1.21	(f) "Medical expense benefit" has the meaning given in section 65B.44, subdivision 2,
1.22	except that medical expenses for rehabilitative services are not subject to section 65B.45.

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2.1	(g) "Personal injury" means a physical injury or mental impairment arising out of and
2.2	in the course of work and includes personal injury caused by occupational disease. A personal
2.2	injury is only covered if the injury occurs to a driver during the driver time periods. Physical
2.4	stimulus resulting in mental injury and mental stimulus resulting in physical injury shall
2.5	remain compensable.

2.6	(c) A (h) "Personal vehicle" means a vehicle that is used by a transportation network
2.7	company <u>TNC</u> driver in connection with providing a prearranged ride and is:
2.8	(1) owned, leased, or otherwise authorized for use by the transportation network company
2.9	driver; and
2.10	(2) not a taxicab, limousine, for-hire vehicle, or a private passenger vehicle driven by a
2.11	volunteer driver.
2.12	(d) A (i) "Prearranged ride" means the provision of transportation by a driver to a rider,
2.13	beginning when a driver accepts a ride requested by a rider through a digital network
2.14	controlled by a transportation network company, continuing while the driver transports a
2.15	requesting rider, and ending when the last requesting rider departs from the personal vehicle.
2.16	A prearranged ride does not include transportation provided using a taxicab, limousine, or
2.17	other for-hire vehicle.
2.18	(j) "Replacement services loss benefits" means all expenses reasonably incurred by or
2.19	on behalf of the nonfatally injured person in obtaining usual and necessary substitute services
2.20	in lieu of those that, had the injured person not been injured, the injured person would have
2.21	performed not for income but for direct personal benefit or for the benefit of the injured
2.22	person's household. If the nonfatally injured person normally, as a full-time responsibility,
2.23	provides care and maintenance of a home with or without children, the benefit to be provided
2.24	under this subdivision shall be the reasonable value of such care and maintenance or the
2.25	reasonable expenses incurred in obtaining usual and necessary substitute care and
2.26	maintenance of the home, whichever is greater.
2.27	(k) "Survivors economic loss benefits" has the meaning given in section 65B.44,
2.28	subdivision 6, except that these benefits are not subject to the weekly maximum amount.
2.29	(1) "Survivor replacement services loss benefits" has the meaning given in section 65B.44,
2.30	subdivision 7, except that these benefits are not subject to the weekly maximum amount.
2.31	(e) A(m) "Transportation network company" or "TNC" means a corporation, partnership,
2.32	sole proprietorship, or other entity that is operating in Minnesota that uses a digital network

to connect transportation network company riders to transportation network company drivers
who provide prearranged rides.

3.3 (f) A (n) "Transportation network company driver," "TNC driver," or "driver" means
3.4 an individual who:

3.5 (1) receives connections to potential riders and related services from a transportation
3.6 network company in exchange for payment of a fee to the transportation network company;
3.7 and

3.8 (2) uses a personal vehicle to provide a prearranged ride to riders upon connection
3.9 through a digital network controlled by a transportation network company in return for
3.10 compensation or payment of a fee.

3.11 (g) A (o) "Transportation network company rider," "TNC rider," or "rider" means an 3.12 individual or persons who use a transportation network company's digital network to connect 3.13 with a transportation network driver who provides prearranged rides to the rider in the 3.14 driver's personal vehicle between points chosen by the rider.

3.15 (h) A (p) "Volunteer driver" means an individual who transports persons or goods on
3.16 behalf of a nonprofit entity or governmental unit in a private passenger vehicle and receives
3.17 no compensation for services provided other than the reimbursement of actual expenses.

3.18 Subd. 2. Maintenance of transportation network financial responsibility. (a) A 3.19 transportation network company driver or transportation network company on the driver's 3.20 behalf shall maintain primary automobile insurance that recognizes that the driver is a 3.21 transportation network company driver or otherwise uses a vehicle to transport passengers 3.22 for compensation and covers the driver: during P1, P2, and P3.

3.23 (1) while the driver is logged on to the transportation network company's digital network;
3.24 or

3.25 (2) while the driver is engaged in a prearranged ride.

3.26 (b) <u>During P1, the following automobile insurance requirements apply while a</u>

The insurance coverage shall be in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 per 5.5 incident due to personal injury and includes medical expense benefits, disability and income 5.6 loss benefits, funeral and burial expenses, replacement services loss benefits, survivor's 5.7 economic loss benefits, and survivor's replacement services loss benefits. 5.8 (e) Any insurer authorized to write accident and sickness insurance in this state shall 5.9 have the power to issue the blanket accident and sickness policy described in paragraph (d). 5.10 (f) A policy of blanket accident and sickness insurance as described in paragraph (d) 5.11 must not be issued or delivered in this state unless a copy of the form has been approved 5.12 by the commissioner. 6.1 (g)(j) Insurance satisfying the requirements of this subdivision shall be deemed to satisfy
6.2 the financial responsibility requirements under the Minnesota No-Fault Automobile Insurance
6.3 Act, sections 65B.41 to 65B.71.

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(h) (k) A transportation network company driver shall carry proof of coverage satisfying 6.4 paragraphs (b) and (c) at all times during the driver's use of a vehicle in connection with a 6.5 transportation network company's digital network. In the event of an accident, a transportation 6.6 network company driver shall provide this insurance coverage information to the directly 6.7 interested parties, automobile insurers, and investigating police officers upon request pursuant 6.8 to section 65B.482, subdivision 1. Upon such request, a transportation network company 6.9 driver shall also disclose to directly interested parties, automobile insurers, and investigating 6.10 police officers whether the driver was logged on to the transportation network company's 6.11 digital network or on a prearranged ride at the time of an accident. 6.12

6.13 Subd. 3. Disclosure to transportation network company drivers. The transportation
6.14 network company shall disclose in writing to transportation network company drivers the
6.15 following before they are allowed to accept a request for a prearranged ride on the
6.16 transportation network company's digital network:

6.17 (1) the insurance coverage, including the types of coverage and the limits for each
6.18 coverage <u>under subdivision 2, paragraphs (b), (c), and (d)</u>, that the transportation network
6.19 company provides while the transportation network company driver uses a personal vehicle
6.20 in connection with a transportation network company's digital network;

(2) that the transportation network company driver's own automobile insurance policy
might not provide any coverage while the driver is logged on to the transportation network
company's digital network and is available to receive transportation requests or is engaged
in a prearranged ride depending on its terms; and

6.25 (3) that using a vehicle with a lien against the vehicle to provide transportation network
6.26 services may violate the transportation network driver's contract with the lienholder.

Subd. 4. Automobile insurance provisions. (a) Insurers that write automobile insurance
in Minnesota may exclude any and all coverage afforded under the owner's insurance policy
for any loss or injury that occurs while a driver is logged on to a transportation network
company's digital network or while a driver provides a prearranged ride during P1, P2, and
P3. This right to exclude all coverage may apply to any coverage included in an automobile
insurance policy including, but not limited to:

6.33 (1) liability coverage for bodily injury and property damage;

7.1 (2) uninsured and underinsure	d motorist coverage;
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- 7.2 (3) basic economic loss benefits as defined under section 65B.44;
- 7.3 (4) medical payments coverage;
- 7.4 (5) comprehensive physical damage coverage; and
- 7.5 (6) collision physical damage coverage.

These exclusions apply notwithstanding any requirement under the Minnesota No-Fault
 Automobile Insurance Act, sections 65B.41 to 65B.71. Nothing in this section implies or
 requires that a personal automobile insurance policy provide coverage while the driver is
 logged on to the transportation network company's digital network, while the driver is
 engaged in a prearranged ride, or while the driver otherwise uses a vehicle to transport
 passengers for compensation during P1, P2, or P3.

7.12 Nothing in this section shall be deemed to preclude an insurer from providing coverage
7.13 for the transportation network company driver's vehicle, if it so chooses to do so by contract
7.14 or endorsement.

(b) Automobile insurers that exclude coverage as permitted in paragraph (a) shall have
no duty to defend or indemnify any claim expressly excluded thereunder. Nothing in this
section shall be deemed to invalidate or limit an exclusion contained in a policy, including
any policy in use or approved for use in Minnesota prior to May 19, 2015, that excludes
coverage for vehicles used to carry persons or property for a charge or available for hire by
the public.

(c) An automobile insurer that defends or indemnifies a claim against a driver that is
excluded under the terms of its policy as permitted in paragraph (a) shall have a right of
contribution against other insurers that provide automobile insurance to the same driver in
satisfaction of the coverage requirements of subdivision 2 at the time of loss.

(d) In a claims coverage investigation, transportation network companies and any insurer 7.25 potentially providing coverage under subdivision 2 shall cooperate to facilitate the exchange 7.26 of relevant information with directly involved parties and any insurer of the transportation 7.27 network company driver if applicable, including the precise times that a transportation 7.28 network company driver logged on and off of the transportation network company's digital 7.29 network in the 12-hour period immediately preceding and in the 12-hour period immediately 7.30 following the accident and disclose to one another a clear description of the coverage, 7.31 exclusions, and limits provided under any automobile insurance maintained under subdivision 7.32 7.33 2.
