additional open educational resources for their courses.

Sec. 3. **APPROPRIATION.**

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\$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2020 and \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2021 are appropriated from
the general fund to the Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities
for developing and offering courses to implement the Z-Degree textbook program under
Minnesota Statutes, section 136F.305.
