## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

- Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 256B.69, is amended by adding a subdivision 1.6 to read: 1.7
- Subd. 6h. Continuity of care for seniors receiving personal assistance. (a) If an individual 65 years of age or older is receiving personal assistance from the same agency continuously during the six months prior to being newly enrolled with any managed care 1.10 or county-based purchasing plan, the managed care plan or county-based purchasing plan 1.11 with which the individual is newly enrolled must allow the enrollee to continue to receive 1.12 any personal assistance otherwise covered under the terms of the plan from the enrollee's 1.13 current agency, provided the enrollee continues to live in the service area of the enrollee's 1.14 1.15 current agency.
  - (b) This subdivision applies only if the enrollee's current agency agrees to accept as payment in full the lesser of either:
    - (1) the managed care plan's or county-based purchasing plan's in-network reimbursement rate for the same covered service at the time the service is provided; or
- (2) the medical assistance fee-for-service rate for the same covered service at the time 1.20 the service is provided. 1.21
