1.7	Subdivision 1. Purpose. Housing support services are established to provide housing					
1.8	support services to an individual with a disability that limits the individual's ability to obtain					
1.9	or maintain stable housing. The services support an individual's transition to housing in the					
1.10	community and increases long-term stability in housing, to avoid future periods of being					
1.11	at-risk of homelessness or institutionalization.					
1.12	Subd. 2. Definitions. (a) For the purposes of this section, the terms defined in this					
1.13	subdivision have the meanings given.					
1.14	(b) "At-risk of homelessness" means (1) an individual that is faced with a set of					
1.15	circumstances likely to cause the individual to become homeless, or (2) an individual					
1.16	previously homeless, who will be discharged from a correctional, medical, mental health,					
1.17	or treatment center, who lacks sufficient resources to pay for housing and does not have a					
1.18	permanent place to live.					
1.19	(c) "Commissioner" means the commissioner of human services.					
1.20	(d) "Homeless" means an individual or family lacking a fixed, adequate nighttime

	(2) demonstrate compliance with federal and state laws and policies for housing support
sei	rvices as determined by the commissioner;
	(3) comply with background study requirements under chapter 245C and maintain
do	cumentation of background study requests and results; and
	(4) directly provide housing support services and not use a subcontractor or reporting
ag	ent.
	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective upon federal approval. The commissioner
of	human services shall notify the revisor of statutes when federal approval is obtained.
