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subdivision 3. 1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA: 1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 245A.51, subdivision 3, is amended to read: 1.6 Subd. 3. Emergency preparedness plan. (a) No later than September 30, 2017, a 1.7 licensed family child care provider must have a written emergency preparedness plan for 1.8 emergencies that require evacuation, sheltering, or other protection of children, such as fire, 1.9 natural disaster, intruder, or other threatening situation that may pose a health or safety 1.10 hazard to children. The plan must be written on a form developed by the commissioner and 1.11 updated at least annually. The plan must include: 1.12 (1) procedures for an evacuation, relocation, shelter-in-place, or lockdown; 1.13 (2) a designated relocation site and evacuation route; 1.14 (3) procedures for notifying a child's parent or legal guardian of the evacuation, 1.15 shelter-in-place, or lockdown, including procedures for reunification with families; 1.16 (4) accommodations for a child with a disability or a chronic medical condition; 1.17 (5) procedures for storing a child's medically necessary medicine that facilitate easy 1.18 removal during an evacuation or relocation; 1.19 (6) procedures for continuing operations in the period during and after a crisis; and 1.20

Section 1. 1 (7) procedures for communicating with local emergency management officials, law enforcement officials, or other appropriate state or local authorities.

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- (b) The license holder must train caregivers before the caregiver provides care and at least annually on the emergency preparedness plan and document completion of this training.
- (c) The license holder must conduct drills according to the requirements in Minnesota Rules, part 9502.0435, subpart 8. The date and time of the drills must be documented.
- (d) The license holder must have the emergency preparedness plan available for review and posted in a prominent location. The license holder must provide a physical or electronic copy of the plan to the child's parent or legal guardian upon enrollment.
