BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
Section 1. PURPOSE.
The legislature finds that students at the elementary level must have the opportunity to
participate in daily recess. The legislature also finds that recess provides children with
unstructured time to engage in physical activity that helps develop healthy minds and bodies.
As childhood obesity rates rise, it is important to ensure that children have time for physical
activity. Insufficient physical activity and excessive calorie consumption are factors in the
increase in childhood obesity rates. As Minnesota strives to be the healthiest state in the
nation, we must continue to encourage our children to engage in physical activity so they
can develop healthy minds and bodies.
