- 1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 97A.441, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
- 1.7 Subdivision 1. **Angling and spearing; disabled residents.** (a) A person authorized to
- 1.8 issue licenses must issue, without a fee, licenses to take fish by angling or spearing to a
- 1.9 resident who is:
- 1.10 (1) blind;
- 1.11 (2) a recipient of Supplemental Security Income for the aged, blind, and disabled;
- 1.12 (3) a recipient of Social Security aid to the disabled under United States Code, title 42,
- 1.13 section 416, paragraph (i)(l), or section 423(d);
- 1.14 (4) a recipient of workers' compensation based on a finding of total and permanent
- 1.15 disability;
- 1.16 (5) 65 years of age or older and was qualified under clause (2) or (3) at the age of 64;
- 1.17 (6) permanently disabled and meets the disability requirements for Supplemental Security
- 1.18 Income or Social Security aid to the disabled under United States Code, title 42, section
- 1.19 416, paragraph (i)(l), or section 423(d);
- 1.20 (7) receiving aid under the federal Railroad Retirement Act of 1974, United States Code,
- 1.21 title 45, section 231a(a)(1)(v); ~~or~~

2.1 (8) a former employee of the United States Postal Service receiving disability pay under
2.2 United States Code, title 5, section 8337; or

2.3 (9) receiving disability pension payments for a total and permanent disability.

2.4 (b) A driver's license or Minnesota identification card bearing the applicable designation
2.5 under section 171.07, subdivision 17, serves as satisfactory evidence to obtain a license
2.6 under this subdivision at all agent locations.
