#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

- 1.7 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 169.13, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
- Subd. 2. **Careless driving.** (a) Any person who operates or halts any vehicle upon any street or highway carelessly or heedlessly in disregard of the rights of others, or in a manner that endangers or is likely to endanger any property or any person, including the driver or passengers of the vehicle, is guilty of a misdemeanor.
  - (b) A person shall not race any vehicle upon any street or highway of this state.

    Any person who willfully compares or contests relative speeds by operating one or more vehicles is guilty of a misdemeanor, whether or not the speed contested or compared is in excess of the maximum speed prescribed by law.
  - (c) A person who violates paragraph (a) or (b), and causes the death of or great bodily harm to another, is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.
- 1.18 (d) For purposes of this section, "great bodily harm" has the meaning given in section 609.02, subdivision 8.
- Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 169.13, subdivision 3, is amended to read:
- 1.21 Subd. 3. **Application.** (a) The provisions of this section apply, but are not limited in application, to any person who drives any vehicle in the manner prohibited by this section:
- 1.23 (1) upon the ice of any lake, stream, or river, including but not limited to the ice of any boundary water; or

### 169.13 RECKLESS OR CARELESS DRIVING.

Subdivision 1. **Reckless driving.** (a) Any person who drives any vehicle in such a manner as to indicate either a willful or a wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property is guilty of reckless driving and such reckless driving is a misdemeanor.

(b) A person shall not race any vehicle upon any street or highway of this state. Any person who willfully compares or contests relative speeds by operating one or more vehicles is guilty of racing, which constitutes reckless driving, whether or not the speed contested or compared is in excess of the maximum speed prescribed by law.
