No person shall be required as a condition of obtaining or continuing 1.8 public sector or private sector employment to: (1) resign or refrain from membership 1.9 in, voluntary affiliation with, or voluntary financial support of a labor organization; (2) 1 10 become or remain a member of a labor organization; (3) pay any dues, fees, assessments, 1 11 or other charges of any kind or amount, or provide anything else of value, to a labor 1.12 organization; or (4) pay to any charity or other third party an amount equivalent to, 1.13 or a portion of, dues, fees, assessments, or other charges required of members of a 1.14 labor organization. An agreement, contract, understanding, or practice between a labor 1.15 organization and an employer that takes force or is extended or renewed after adoption of 1 16 this section and that violates this section is unlawful and unenforceable. A person who 1.17 suffers an injury or a threatened injury under this section may bring a civil action for 1 18 damages, injunctive relief, or both. In addition, a court shall award a prevailing plaintiff 1 19 costs and reasonable attorney fees. As used in this section, "labor organization" means any 1.20 agency, union, employee representation committee, or organization of any kind that exists 1.21 for the purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with employers concerning wages, rates 1.22 of pay, hours of work, other conditions of employment, or other forms of compensation. 1.23
