1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 129C.10, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.8	Subdivision 1. Governance. (a) The board of the Perpich Center for Arts Education
1.9	shall consist of 15 persons, one of whom must have served as a school administrator or as
1.10	an elected school board member, one of whom is a locally or regionally recognized
1.11	professional artist, one of whom is a secondary or postsecondary arts educator, and one of
1.12	whom has experience administering a statewide outreach program. The members of the
1.13	board shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate. At least
1.14	one member must be appointed from each congressional district.
1.15	(b) All board members must complete board training requirements consistent with section
1.16	127A.19.
1.17	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment and
1.18	applies to board member appointments made after that date. The governor shall determine
1.19	which board member terms end on the effective date of this section to appoint four qualified
1.20	board members.

- Subd. 3b. **Appeal.** A parent who disagrees with a board action that adversely affects the academic program of an enrolled pupil may appeal the board's action to the commissioner of education within 30 60 days of the board's action. The decision of the commissioner shall be binding on the board. The board must inform each pupil and parent at the time of enrolling of a parent's right to appeal a board action affecting the pupil's academic program.

- Subd. 4. **Employees.** (a)(1) The board must appoint a director of the Center for Arts

 Education who shall serve in the unclassified service. The director must be a licensed school superintendent.
- 2.11 (2) The board must employ, upon recommendation of the director, a coordinator of resource programs who shall serve in the unclassified service.
 - (3) The board must employ, upon recommendation of the director, up to six department chairs and at least one licensed secondary school principal who shall serve in the unclassified service. The chairs shall be licensed teachers unless no licensure exists for the subject area or discipline for which the chair is hired.

The first report must be submitted by December 15, 2017. 2.29 Subsequent reports must be submitted each year on December 15 with the final report due 2.30 on December 17, 2022. 2.31
