1.15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.16 **ARTICLE 1**

1.17 **APPROPRIATIONS**

1.18 Section 1. **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS.**

1.19 The sums shown in the column under "Appropriations" are appropriated from the
1.20 bond proceeds fund, or another named fund, to the state agencies or officials indicated,
1.21 to be spent for public purposes. Appropriations of bond proceeds must be spent as
1.22 authorized by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 5, paragraph (a), to acquire
1.23 and better public land and buildings and other public improvements of a capital nature, or
1.24 as authorized by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 5, paragraphs (b) to (j),
1.25 or article XIV. Unless otherwise specified, money appropriated in this act for a capital
1.26 program or project may be used to pay state agency staff costs that are attributed directly
1.27 to the capital program or project in accordance with accounting policies adopted by the
1.28 commissioner of management and budget. Unless otherwise specified, the appropriations

2.1 in this act are available until the project is completed or abandoned subject to Minnesota
 2.2 Statutes, section 16A.642. Unless otherwise specified in this act, money appropriated in
 2.3 this act for activities under Minnesota Statutes, sections 16B.307, 84.946, and 135A.046,
 2.4 should not be used for projects that can be financed within a reasonable time frame under
 2.5 Minnesota Statutes, section 16B.322 or 16C.144.
