1.17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.18 **ARTICLE 1**

1.19 **APPROPRIATIONS**

1.20 Section 1. **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS.**

1.21 The sums shown in the column under "Appropriations" are appropriated from the

1.22 bond proceeds fund, or another named fund, to the state agencies or officials indicated,

1.23 to be spent for public purposes. Appropriations of bond proceeds must be spent as

1.24 authorized by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 5, paragraph (a), to acquire

1.25 and better public land and buildings and other public improvements of a capital nature, or

1.26 as authorized by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 5, paragraphs (b) to (j),

1.27 or article XIV. Unless otherwise specified, money appropriated in this act for a capital

1.28 program or project may be used to pay state agency staff costs that are attributed directly

2.1 to the capital program or project in accordance with accounting policies adopted by the
 2.2 commissioner of management and budget. Unless otherwise specified, the appropriations
 2.3 in this act are available until the project is completed or abandoned subject to Minnesota
 2.4 Statutes, section 16A.642. Unless otherwise specified in this act, money appropriated in
 2.5 this act for activities under Minnesota Statutes, sections 16B.307, 84.946, and 135A.046,
 2.6 should not be used for projects that can be financed within a reasonable time frame under
 2.7 Minnesota Statutes, section 16B.322 or 16C.144.

 7.33 committed before the bonds are sold.

8.1 (c) The commissioner of management and
8.2 budget shall reduce the board's assessment
8.3 each year by one-third of the net income
8.4 from investment of general obligation bond
8.5 proceeds in proportion to the amount of
8.6 principal and interest otherwise required to
8.7 be paid by the board. The board shall pay its
8.8 resulting net assessment to the commissioner
8.9 of management and budget by December
8.10 1 each year. If the board fails to make
8.11 a payment when due, the commissioner
8.12 of management and budget shall reduce
8.13 allotments for appropriations from the
8.14 general fund otherwise available to the board
8.15 and apply the amount of the reduction to
8.16 cover the missed debt service payment. The
8.17 commissioner of management and budget
8.18 shall credit the payments received from the
8.19 board to the bond debt service account in
8.20 the state bond fund each December 1 before
8.21 money is transferred from the general fund
8.22 under Minnesota Statutes, section 16A.641,

67.20 (a) Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, sections 16A.695 and 16B.281 to 16B.296,
67.21 the commissioner of administration may convey to the city of Bayport for no consideration
67.22 the surplus land that is described in paragraph (c).

67.23 (b) The conveyance must be in a form approved by the attorney general and provide
67.24 that the lands revert to the state if the city of Bayport stops using the land for the public
67.25 purpose described in paragraph (d). The attorney general may make changes to the land
67.26 description to correct errors and ensure accuracy.

67.27 (c) The land to be conveyed is located in Washington County and is described as:

67.28 That part of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter, Section 3, Township 29
67.29 North, Range 20 West, Washington County, Minnesota, described as follows:

67.30 Commencing at the southeast corner of said Southeast Quarter of the Southwest
67.31 Quarter; thence South 89 degrees 28 minutes 13 seconds West, assigned bearing, along
67.32 the south line of said Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter, a distance of 665.22
67.33 feet to the easterly right-of-way line of Stagecoach Trail North (A.K.A. County State-Aid
67.34 Highway 21); thence North 00 degrees 31 minutes 47 seconds West, along said easterly
67.35 right-of-way line, 60.00 feet to the point of beginning of the tract to be herein described;

68.1 thence North 34 degrees 35 minutes 03 seconds West, along said right-of-way line, 112.00
68.2 feet; thence North 21 degrees 21 minutes 41 seconds East, along said right-of-way line,
68.3 508.03 feet; thence South 70 degrees 24 minutes 54 seconds East, 250.49 feet; thence
68.4 South 00 degrees 08 minutes 49 seconds East, 478.06 feet to the northerly right-of-way
68.5 line of County State-Aid Highway 14 (A.K.A. 5th Avenue North); thence South 89
68.6 degrees 28 minutes 13 seconds West, along said northerly right-of-way line, 358.72 feet to
68.7 the point of beginning. Subject to easements, restrictions, and reservations of record.

68.8 (d) The commissioner has determined that the land is no longer needed for any state
68.9 purpose and that the state's land management interests would best be served if the land
68.10 was conveyed to and used by the city of Bayport for a fire station.
