1.7	Section 1. [473.4056] LIGHT RAIL TRANSIT VEHICLE DESIGN.
1.8	Subdivision 1. Adoption of standards. (a) By January 1, 2015, the Metropolitan
1.9	Council shall adopt and may thereafter amend standards for the design of light rail
1.10	vehicles that are reasonably necessary to provide access for, and to protect the health and
