.6	Section 1. [325E.68] DEFINITIONS.
.7	Subdivision 1. Terms. For purposes of sections 325E.68 to 325E.70, the terms
.8	defined in this section have the meanings given.
.9	Subd. 2. Event. "Event" means a concert, theatrical performance, sporting event,
.10	exhibition, show, or similar scheduled activity taking place in this state:
.11	(1) that is open to the general public;
.12	(2) for which an admission fee is charged; and
.13	(3) that is held in a venue accommodating more than 2,500 persons, including
.14	but not limited to those venues for which public funding has been provided for the
.15	construction, maintenance, or operation of the venue or any infrastructure related to it, or

.17	Subd. 3. Event ticket. "Event ticket" means the physical, electronic, or other form
