Subdiv	ision 1. Establishment. The commissioner of human services shall establish
and appoint a	a task force on the impact of adverse childhood experiences (ACES) and
preventive ar	nd trauma-informed policy and practices consisting of the following members:
<u>(1) the</u>	commissioners of human services, public safety, health, and education or the
commissione	ers' designees;
(2) two	members representing law enforcement with expertise in juvenile justice;
(3) two	members representing county social services agencies;
(4) four	r members representing racial and ethnic minority groups most impacted
by ACES in	Minnesota;
(5) two	members representing tribal social services providers;
(6) two	members with expertise in prekindergarten through grade 12 education;
(7) thre	ee licensed health care professionals with expertise in the neurobiology of
childhood de	evelopment representing public health, mental health, and primary health;
(8) one	member representing family service or children's mental health collaboratives;
(9) two	parents or caregivers from racial and ethnic minority groups most impacted

2.4	Subd. 2. Staff. The commissioner of human services shall provide meeting space,
2.5	support staff, and administrative services for the task force.
2.6	Subd. 3. Duties. The task force shall perform the following duties:
2.7	(1) engage human services, education, public health, juvenile justice, and the
2.8	criminal justice systems in the creation of trauma-informed policy and practices in each of
2.9	these systems to prevent adverse childhood experiences from occurring and support the
2.10	health and well-being of all families; and
2.11	(2) identify social determinants of health and well-being and recommend solutions
2.12	to eliminate racial and ethnic disparities in the state.
2.13	Subd. 4. Report. The task force shall submit a report on the result of its study and
2.14	any policy recommendations to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative
2.15	committees and divisions with jurisdiction over health and human services, public safety,
2.16	judiciary, and education by January 15, 2016.
2.17	Subd. 5. Expiration. The task force expires upon submission of the report required
2.18	under subdivision 4.
