1.5	Section 1. WOLF-LIVESTOCK CONFLICT PREVENTION PILOT PROGRAM.
1.6	(a) The commissioner of agriculture may award grants to livestock producers to prevent
1.7	wolf-livestock conflicts. Livestock producers located in Minnesota are eligible to apply for
1.8	reimbursement for the cost of practices to prevent wolf-livestock conflicts. The commissioner
1.9	may establish a cap on the amount a recipient is eligible to receive annually.
1.10	(b) To be eligible for a grant under this section, a livestock producer must raise livestock
1.11	within Minnesota's wolf range or on property determined by the commissioner to be affected
1.12	by wolf-livestock conflicts.
1.13	(c) Eligible wolf-livestock conflict prevention activities include but are not limited to:
1.14	(1) the purchase of guard animals;
1.15	(2) payment of veterinary costs for guard animals;
1.16	(3) the installation of wolf barriers, which may include pens, fladry, and fencing necessary
1.17	to protect livestock;
1.18	(4) the installation of wolf-deterring lights and alarms; and
