- 1.2 relating to higher education; appropriating money for a mental health training
- 1.3 program for University of Minnesota pediatric residents; requiring a report.
- 1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
- 1.5 Section 1. **MENTAL HEALTH TRAINING PROGRAM FOR PEDIATRIC**
- 1.6 **RESIDENTS.**
- 1.7 (a) The Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota is requested to develop a clinical
- 1.8 mental health training program located in outpatient child psychiatric care clinics for pediatric
- 1.9 residents. The training program shall:
- 1.10 (1) place pediatric residents in multidisciplinary mental health teams;
- 1.11 (2) provide education on conducting comprehensive clinical mental health assessments
- 1.12 and potential pharmacological therapy;
- 1.13 (3) provide psychiatric consultation to pediatric residents in their primary care community
- 1.14 clinic rotation;
- 1.15 (4) emphasize longitudinal care for patients with behavioral health needs; and
- 1.16 (5) develop partnerships with community resources.
- 1.17 (b) On or before February 1, 2021, the Board of Regents must report to the chairs and
- 1.18 ranking minority members of the legislative committees with primary jurisdiction over
- 1.19 higher education finance on the training program for pediatric residents under paragraph
- 1.20 (a), including the measured outcomes used to evaluate the impact and effectiveness of the
- 1.21 training program.
