Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2015 Supplement, section 144A.75, subdivision 13, is amended to read:

- Subd. 13. **Residential hospice facility.** (a) "Residential hospice facility" means a facility that resembles a single-family home located in a residential area that directly provides 24-hour residential and support services in a home-like setting for hospice patients as an integral part of the continuum of home care provided by a hospice; that provides care for hospice patients, or for children who need respite care or palliative care due to a life-threatening condition requiring care 24 hours a day, seven days a week; and that houses:
- (1) no more than eight hospice patients or children who need respite care or palliative care; or
- (2) at least nine and no more than 12 hospice patients <u>or children who need respite</u> <u>care or palliative care,</u> with the approval of the local governing authority, notwithstanding section 462.357, subdivision 8.
- (b) Residential hospice facility also means a facility that directly provides 24-hour residential and support services for hospice patients and that:
 - (1) houses no more than 21 hospice patients;
- 1.23 (2) meets hospice certification regulations adopted pursuant to title XVIII of the 1.24 federal Social Security Act, United States Code, title 42, section 1395, et seq.; and
