Section 1. HANNAH'S LAW.

This act may be cited as "Hannah's Law."

Subd. 4. **Cardiopulmonary resuscitation.** (a) All teachers and assistant teachers

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who are employed by a child care center governed by Minnesota Rules, parts 9503.0005

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to 9503.0170 must satisfactorily complete training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation

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(CPR) and in the treatment of obstructed airways including CPR techniques for infants

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and children. ~~When children are present in a child care center governed by Minnesota~~

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~~Rules, parts 9503.0005 to 9503.0170,~~ at least one staff person must be present in the

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center who has ~~been trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and in the treatment~~

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~~of obstructed airways.~~ satisfactorily completed CPR training. During field trips and when

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transporting children in care, all teachers, assistant teachers, and at least one staff person

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must have completed CPR training. For the purposes of this subdivision, each teacher,

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assistant teacher, and staff person must complete CPR training within 90 days after the

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start of employment unless the individual has completed CPR training within the previous

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three years. The CPR training must have been provided by an individual approved to

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provide CPR instruction, must be repeated at least once every three years, and must be

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documented in the staff person's records.
