1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 86B.313, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.6	Subdivision 1. General requirements. (a) In addition to requirements of other laws
1.7	relating to watercraft, a person may not operate or permit the operation of a personal
1.8	watercraft:
1.9	(1) without each person on board the personal watercraft wearing a wearable personal
1.10	flotation device that is approved by the United States Coast Guard (USCG) and has a USCG
1.11	label indicating the flotation device either is approved for or does not prohibit use with
1.12	personal watercraft;
1.13	(2) between one hour before sunset and 9:30 a.m.;
1.14	(3) (2) at greater than slow-no wake speed within 150 feet of:
1.15	(i) a shoreline;
1.16	(ii) a dock;
1.17	(iii) a swimmer;
1.18	(iv) a raft used for swimming or diving; or
1.19	(v) a moored, anchored, or nonmotorized watercraft;

- 2.1 (4)(3) while towing a person on water skis, a kneeboard, an inflatable craft, or any other 2.2 device unless:
- 2.3 (i) an observer is on board; or
- 2.4 (ii) the personal watercraft is equipped with factory-installed or factory-specified
 2.5 accessory mirrors that give the operator a wide field of vision to the rear;
- 2.6 (5) (4) without the lanyard-type engine cutoff switch being attached to the person,

2.7 clothing, or personal flotation device of the operator, if the personal watercraft is equipped

2.8 by the manufacturer with such a device;

- 2.9 (6)(5) if any part of the spring-loaded throttle mechanism has been removed, altered, 2.10 or tampered with so as to interfere with the return-to-idle system;
- 2.11 (7) (6) to chase or harass wildlife;
- 2.12 (8)(7) through emergent or floating vegetation at other than a slow-no wake speed;
- 2.13 (9)(8) in a manner that unreasonably or unnecessarily endangers life, limb, or property,
- 2.14 including weaving through congested watercraft traffic, jumping the wake of another
- 2.15 watercraft within 150 feet of the other watercraft, or operating the watercraft while facing
- 2.16 backward;

2.17 (10)(9) in any other manner that is not reasonable and prudent; or

- 2.18 (11)(10) without a personal watercraft rules decal, issued by the commissioner, attached 2.19 to the personal watercraft so as to be in full view of the operator.
- (b) Paragraph (a), clause (3) (2), does not apply to a person operating a personal watercraft
 to launch or land a person on water skis, a kneeboard, or similar device by the most direct
 route to open water.
