1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 624.731, subdivision 4, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 4. Prohibited use. (a) No person shall knowingly, or with reason to know, use
1.8	tear gas, a tear gas compound, an authorized tear gas compound, or an electronic
1.9	incapacitation device on or against a peace officer who is in the performance of duties.
1.10	(b) No person shall use tear gas, a tear gas compound, an authorized tear gas compound,
1.11	or an electronic incapacitation device except as authorized in subdivision 2 or 6.
