1.6	Section 1. [471.3459] DONATION OF SURPLUS EQUIPMENT.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Definitions. (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms

1.9	(b) "Local government" means a county, home rule or statutory city, or town.
1.10	(c) "Nonprofit organization" means an organization formed under section 501(c)(3)
1.11	of the Internal Revenue Code.
1.12	(d) "Surplus equipment" means cellular phones and emergency medical and fire
1.13	fighting equipment that is no longer needed by the local government because it does not
1.14	meet industry standards for emergency medical services, police, or fire departments or
