1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 331A.12, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 2. Designation. At the meeting of the governing body of a political subdivision
1.8	at which the governing body designates its official newspaper for the year, the governing
1.9	body may designate in the same manner publication of transportation projects, proceedings,
1.10	official notices, and summaries on the political subdivision's Web site. Publication on the
1.11	Web site may be used in place of or in addition to any other required form of publication.
1.12	Each year after designating publication on the Web site for transportation projects,
1.13	proceedings, official notices, and summaries, the political subdivision must publish, in a
1.14	qualified newspaper in the jurisdiction and on the Web site, notice that the political
1.15	subdivision will publish any advertisements for bids, proceedings, official notices, and
