1.7	otherwise discriminate against, or penalize an employee regarding the employee's
1.8	compensation, terms, conditions, location, or privileges of employment because:
1.9	(1) the employee, or a person acting on behalf of an employee, in good faith, reports a
1.10	violation, suspected violation, or planned violation of any federal or state law or common
1.11	law or rule adopted pursuant to law to an employer or to any governmental body or law
1.12	enforcement official;
