If a prime contractor or 5.16 any subcontractor retains additional subcontractors on the project after submitting its 5.17 verification of compliance, the prime contractor or subcontractor shall obtain verifications 5.18 of compliance from each additional subcontractor with which it has a direct contractual 5.19 5.20 relationship and shall submit a supplemental verification confirming compliance with subdivision 3, clause (7), within 14 days of retaining the additional subcontractors. 5.21 A prime contractor shall submit to the contracting authority upon request copies of 5.22 5.23 the signed verifications of compliance from all subcontractors of any tier pursuant to subdivision 3, clause (7). A prime contractor and subcontractors shall not be responsible 5.24 for the false statements of any subcontractor with which they do not have a direct 5.25 5.26 contractual relationship. A prime contractor and subcontractors shall be responsible for false statements by their first-tier subcontractors with which they have a direct contractual 5.27 relationship only if they accept the verification of compliance with actual knowledge 5.28 that it contains a false statement. 5.29 Subd. 6. Additional criteria. Nothing in this section shall restrict the discretion of a 5.30 contracting authority to establish additional criteria for defining a responsible contractor. 5.31 Subd. 7. Implementation. The definition of responsible contractor, as defined 5.32 in subdivision 3, or a statement that the term responsible contractor as used in the 5.33 solicitation document means a contractor as defined in subdivision 3, shall be included 5.34 5.35 in the solicitation document for all projects covered by this section. The solicitation document for any project shall state that any prime contractor or subcontractor that does 5.36

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not meet the minimum criteria in subdivision 3 or fails to verify that it meets those 6.1 criteria is not a responsible contractor and is not eligible to be awarded a construction 6.2 contract for the project or to perform work on the project. The solicitation document 6.3 shall provide that a false statement under oath verifying compliance with any of the 6.4 minimum criteria shall render the prime contractor or subcontractor that makes the false 6.5 statement ineligible to be awarded a construction contract on the project and may result in 6.6 termination of a contract awarded to a prime contractor or subcontractor that submits a 6.7 false statement. The solicitation document shall state that a prime contractor shall submit 6.8 to the contracting authority upon request copies of the signed verifications of compliance 6.9 from all subcontractors of any tier pursuant to subdivision 3, clause (7). 6.10 Subd. 8. Effective date.
