1.8	(a) A person may take a bear at any time to protect the person's property. The person
1.9	must report the bear taken to a conservation officer within 48 hours. The bear may be
1.10	disposed of as prescribed by the commissioner.
1.11	(b) The commissioner must issue a bear control special permit according to section
1.12	97A.401 for 12 or more wildlife control operators to take nuisance bear by live trapping
1.13	and relocating the bear. When a bear is trapped and released, an enforcement officer or a
1.14	wildlife manager may approve the release location. The commissioner must provide specific
1.15	training to wildlife control operators who are issued a permit under this paragraph, including
1.16	a refresher course every five years. The commissioner may not charge a fee for the bear
1.17	control special permit or training. A wildlife control operator with a special permit issued

under this paragraph may use remote surveillance equipment to monitor live traps.
