Section 1. Laws 2020, chapter 71, article 1, section 11, is amended to read: 1.6

Sec. 11. TRANSFERS; SMALL BUSINESS EMERGENCY LOAN PROGRAM.

Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, sections 116J.423 and 116J.8731, in fiscal year 2020, the following amounts are transferred to the small business emergency loan account in the special revenue fund under Minnesota Statutes, section 116M.18, subdivision 9:

- (1) \$20,000,000 from the special revenue fund account of the Minnesota 21st century fund under Minnesota Statutes, section 116J.423, subdivision 1; and
- (2) \$10,000,000 from the Minnesota investment revolving loan account under Minnesota 1.13 Statutes, section 116J.8731, subdivision 5, in the special revenue fund. 1.14

Transferred amounts are appropriated to the commissioner of employment and economic development to make loans as set forth in Governor's Executive Order 20-15, Providing Immediate Relief to Small Businesses During the COVID-19 Peacetime Emergency. Any business may receive a loan through the small business emergency loan program at the discretion of the commissioner of employment and economic development. The business must demonstrate to the lender that it was directly and adversely affected by the COVID-19 peacetime emergency under Executive Order 20-04, 20-08, or 20-09. All loan repayments are credited proportionately to the accounts from which the loan amounts were originally
