12	Chapter Twenty-Four: State Teacher Employment Bureau (State
13	Education Placement Bureau)
14	5 MCAR S 1.0460 Enrollment.
15	A. Application. Enrollment with the State Feacher Education
16	Placement Bureau shall be conditioned upon completion of the
17	enrollment form by a qualified applicant and the payment of the
18	enrollment fee.
19	A qualified applicant is one who meets the standards stated
20	in Minn. Stat. S 121.26.
21	B. Fee. Within the limits of the law, the Commissioner of
22	Education shall recommend to the State Board of Education the
23	amount of the nonrefundable enrollment fee to be paid by the
24	applicant.
25	C. Time duration. Upon payment of the enrollment fee, the
26	applicant shall be entitled to the services of the bureau from
27	the time of fee payment until the next October 1st. The
28	enrollment period covered by the fee may be less than one year,
29	but shall not exceed one year.
30	D. Re-enrollment. Following the October 1st expiration of
31	enrollment each year, applicants' papers will be held for nine
32	months, until July 1st. If the applicant re-enrolls during the
33	period between October 1st and July 1st of the following year,
34	the applicant shall do so by completing a new enrollment form
35	and by paying the required fee. Re-enrollment after July 1st
36	shall require a new completed enrollment form, the accompaniment

1 of the required fee, and a new list of references.

2 E. Photograph. The bureau shall not require the applicant 3 to submit a photograph nor shall the bureau show or send the 4 applicant's photograph to any school official.

5 5 MCAR S 1.0461 Credentials.

6 A. Recommendations. The bureau shall secure written 7 recommendations relating to the preparation, experience, and character of the applicant from three persons who have been 8 listed on the enrollment form. If the applicant re-enrolls 9 within a five-year period wherein recommendations are maintained 10 11 in the files, those recommendations already on file shall be 12 used for references. Only recommendations from the three persons named by the applicant on the most recent enrollment 13 14 form shall be maintained for the five-year period.

15 Recommendations from references no longer named by the applicant 16 on the most recent enrollment form shall be destroyed.

B. Applicant's file. When a an applicant accepts a position, the credentials shall be placed in the inactive file; the file shall be reactivated upon the request of the applicant at any time during the remainder of the enrollment year for which the applicant has paid the required fee.

22 C. Transfer and destruction of files. After a time lapse of 23 five years following the expiration of the applicant's last 24 enrollment and in compliance with appropriate Minnesota 25 Statutes, the bureau shall destroy the inactive file. During 26 the intervening time, the applicant may request, in writing, 27 transfer of papers to any placement agency or re-enroll in the 28 bureau.

D. Notice of vacancies. Applicants shall be furnished information relative to vacancies received by the bureau but should apply only for those positions for which the applicant holds or is eligible to hold Minnesota licensure.

33 E. Providing credentials. The bureau shall make credentials 34 of an applicant available to employing officials of school 35 districts upon their request or upon the request of the 36 applicant.

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1 F. Recommendation of applicants. The bureau shall not 2 recommend applicants for positions but shall present papers of 3 applicants which are on file to employing officials. 4 G. Reciprocity. The bureau may establish reciprocal relations with members of the Association for School, College, 5 and University Staffing, and other noncommercial teacher 6 placement agencies in Minnesota and other states. Papers from 7 8 other agencies will no longer be maintained in bureau files.

9 Repealer. EDU 462 is repealed.

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
