7 6 MCAR S 8.403 Eligibility criteria.

8 A. [Unchanged.]

9 B. Eligible projects. Only projects which demonstrate
 10 feasible and prudent alternatives to disposal are eligible for
 11 loans and grants. To qualify as a demonstration project, a
 12 project must be conceptually and technically feasible but not
 13 now in operation in the state or not now in operation in a
 14 geographical area of the state with demonstrably different
 15 characteristics from those of the area where a facility is now
 16 in operation. A conceptually and technically feasible project
 17 may also qualify as a demonstration project if it involves
 18 institutional arrangements not previously utilized in the state,
 19 or not previously utilized in a geographical area of the state
 20 with demonstrably different characteristics from those in the
 21 area where a facility is now in operation. Six types of
 22 projects are eligible for loans and grants: waste to energy;
 23 materials recovery; chemical, physical, or biological
 24 modifications; transfer stations; special waste streams; and
 25 waste incineration with resource recovery.

27 6 MCAR S 8.404 Information required on the grant and loan
28 application.

29 Applications for grants and loans for waste processing
30 facilities shall include the following information as required
31 in the application forms supplied by the board:

33 11. the type of waste processing facility for which a
34 grant or loan is being applied for: waste to energy; materials
35 recovery; chemical, physical, or biological modification;

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1 transfer stations; special waste stream; or waste incineration
2 with resource recovery.

5 H. Waste incineration with resource recovery factors. Waste
6 incineration with resource recovery other than energy recovery
7 is eligible if a substantial level of resource recovery is a
8 component of the overall solid waste management of the
9 applicant. For incineration with resource recovery the board
10 will consider:

11 1. the percent of the total waste stream subjected to
12 resource recovery;

13 2. the percent and types of materials recovered from the
14 total waste stream;

15 3. the revenue derived from recovered materials;

16 4. the relationship of the recovered materials to the
17 waste incinerated; and

18 5. the economic evaluation of all potentially recoverable
19 materials.
