This fee includes administrative costs, supplies 6 to registered agents, and 20 minutes of equipment calibration 7 time. Where calibration costs exceed this limit, the regular 8 laboratory calibration rate will be charged. 9 Subp. 2. Other rates. The fees in subpart 1 are based on 10 the average amount of time required for an individual inspection 11 and test. This average includes travel, equipment, and 12 administrative costs. For a nonroutine inspection and test, or 13 when a device is not specified in subpart 1, the inspector shall 14 calculate the total charge based on the following hourly rates: 15 A. \$45 for one inspector and appropriate test 16 equipment designated for light capacity scale and volumetric 17 equipment testing; 18 19 в. \$60 for one inspector and appropriate test equipment designated for heavy capacity scale testing; and 20 C.
