- 29 Subpart 1. Applications reviewed. The chairperson or a
- 30 designee shall review all applications received.

- 33 determine the eligibility of the applicant, the eligibility of
- 34 the costs specified in the application, the eligibility of the
- 35 project specified in the application, and the completeness of

- 3 receiving the application, the chairperson shall notify each
- 4 applicant of the chairperson's determinations. If the

- 34 Subpart 1. Process of evaluation. Upon completion of the
- 35 chairperson's initial review of the application as set out in
- 36 part 9200.8700, the board shall evaluate projects based on the

- Subp. 2. General factors. In evaluating all six types of 2
- projects the board shall, to the extent the factor is relevant 3
- to the project, consider: 4
