- 7 7045.0020 DEFINITIONS.
- 8 Subpart 1. to 52. [Unchanged.]
- 9 Subp. 53. Manifest. "Manifest" means the shipping
- 10 document originated and signed by the generator in accordance
- 11 with part 7045.0261.
- 12 Subp. 54. Manifest document number. "Manifest document
- 13 number" means the United States EPA 12-digit identification
- 14 number assigned to the generator plus a unique five-digit number
- 15 assigned to the manifest by the generator for recording and
- 16 reporting purposes.
- 17 Subp. 55. to 108. [Unchanged.]
- 18 7045.0261 MANIFEST DOCUMENT; GENERAL REQUIREMENTS.
- 19 Subpart 1. When required. A generator who transports or
- 20 offers for transportation hazardous waste for off-site
- 21 treatment, storage, or disposal must prepare a manifest before
- 22 transporting the waste off-site. Generators shall use manifests
- 23 in accordance with the requirements of items A to C and shall
- 24 complete the manifest in accordance with the instructions on the
- 25 manifest.
- 26 A. For shipments from either in-state or out-of-state
- 27 to a facility located in Minnesota, the generator shall use a
- 28 Minnesota manifest (Minnesota Form PQ-00371-01) and, if
- 29 necessary, continuation sheets as provided in subpart 10.
- 30 B. For shipments from Minnesota to a facility located
- 31 in a state (consignment state) that neither supplies nor
- 32 requires the use of a manifest which is specific for that state,
- 33 the generator shall use a Minnesota manifest (Minnesota Form
- 34 PQ-00371-01) and, if necessary, continuation sheets as provided
- 35 in subpart 10.

- 1 C. For shipments from Minnesota to a facility located
- 2 in a state (consignment state) that requires the use of a
- 3 manifest which is specific for that state, the generator shall
- 4 use that manifest.
- 5 Subp. 2. to 6. [Unchanged.]
- 6 Subp. 7. Manifest information. The Minnesota manifest
- 7 (Minnesota Form PQ-00371-01) is based on the Uniform National
- 8 Manifest (EPA Form 8700-22) that is required under United States
- 9 Department of Transportation and United States Environmental
- 10 Protection Agency regulations, as contained in Code of Federal
- 11 Regulations, title 40, part 262, and Code of Federal
- 12 Regulations, title 49, part 172. Manifest information
- 13 requirements include those required by United States Department
- 14 of Transportation and United States Environmental Protection
- 15 Agency regulations and consist of the numbered items on the
- 16 manifest set forth in the Appendix to Code of Federal
- 17 Regulations, title 40, part 262. Additional state information
- 18 requirements consist of the telephone number of the designated
- 19 facility and the hazardous waste numbers specified in parts
- 20 7045.0100 to 7045.0141 for each hazardous waste specified on the
- 21 manifest. Manifests must include the information specified in
- 22 this subpart and in the instructions on the manifest.
- Subp. 8. Availability of manifests. Minnesota manifests
- 24 (Minnesota Form PQ-00371-01) are available from the agency or
- 25 the documents section of the Minnesota Department of
- 26 Administration, 117 University Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota 55155.
- 27 Subp. 9. Number of copies. The manifest must consist of
- 28 at least the number of copies which will provide the generator,
- 29 each transporter, and the owner or operator of the designated
- 30 facility with one copy each for their records, another copy to
- 31 be returned to the generator by the facility, and the required
- 32 copies to be returned to the director, pursuant to parts
- 33 7045.0265; 7045.0474, subpart 2, item D; and 7045.0580, subpart
- 34 2, item D, and any additional copies required by the generator's
- 35 or designated facility's state, if other than Minnesota. Copies
- 36 to be returned to the director shall be sent to: Minnesota

- 4 Subp. 10. Continuation sheets. A generator using a
- 5 Minnesota manifest (Minnesota Form PQ-00371-01) shall use a
- 6 continuation sheet to the manifest if more than two transporters
- 7 are to be used to transport the waste. A generator using a
- 8 Minnesota manifest (Minnesota Form PQ-00371-01) shall use either
- 9 a continuation sheet to the manifest or an additional manifest
- 10 which is completed in its entirety, if more space is required
- 11 for the United States Department of Transportation description
- 12 and related information on the manifest. Any United States
- 13 Environmental Protection Agency approved continuation sheet may
- 14 be used if it is completed and copies are distributed in
- 15 accordance with this part and United States Environmental
- 16 Protection Agency regulations as contained in Code of Federal
- 17 Regulations, title 40, part 262. A generator using a
- 18 continuation sheet to a Minnesota manifest (Minnesota Form
- 19 PQ-00371-01) shall enter the preprinted State Manifest Document
- 20 Number of the manifest into the appropriate space on the
- 21 continuation sheet, and shall attach the sheet to the manifest.
- 22 Continuation sheets are not provided by the state. For
- 23 shipments not requiring a Minnesota manifest (Minnesota Form
- 24 PQ-00371-01), generators shall use continuation sheets in
- 25 accordance with applicable consignment state requirements.
- 26 7045.0302 INTERNATIONAL SHIPMENTS; SPECIAL CONDITIONS.
- 27 Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]
- 28 Subp. 2. Procedures. When shipping hazardous waste
- 29 outside the state of Minnesota to a foreign country the
- 30 generator must:
- 31 A. [Unchanged.]
- 32 B. require that the foreign consignee confirm the
- 33 delivery of the waste in the foreign country. A copy of the
- 34 manifest signed by the foreign consignee may be used for this
- 35 purpose;
- 36 C. meet the requirements under parts 7045.0261 and

- 1 7045.0265 for the manifest except that:
- 2 (1) in place of the name, address, and
- 3 identification number of the designated facility, the name and
- 4 address of the foreign consignee must be used; and
- 5 (2) the generator must identify the point of
- 6 departure from the United States through which the waste must
- 7 travel before entering a foreign country; and
- D. use a Minnesota manifest (Minnesota Form

- 12 person must use a Minnesota manifest (Minnesota Form

- 18 Subp. 2. Definition of a discrepancy. Manifest
- 19 discrepancies are defined as significant or minor as follows:
- 20 A. Significant discrepancies include differences
- 21 between the quantity or type of hazardous waste designated on
- 22 the manifest or shipping paper and the quantity or type of
- 23 hazardous waste a facility actually receives. Significant
- 24 discrepancies in quantity are weight differences for bulk wastes
- 25 greater than ten percent and any variation in piece count for
- 26 batch waste, such as a difference of one drum in a truckload.
- 27 Significant discrepancies in types of waste are obvious
- 28 differences which can be discovered by inspection or waste
- 29 analysis, such as waste solvent substituted for waste acid, or
- 30 toxic constituents not reported on the manifest or shipping
- 31 paper.
- 32 B. Minor discrepancies are all other discrepancies
- 33 including, but not limited to, manifests other than the required
- 34 Minnesota manifest (Minnesota Form PQ-00371-01), incomplete
- 35 manifests or shipping papers, manifests or shipping papers which
- 36 are inconsistent, and a container or portable tank containing
