8 6700.0900 CONTINUING EDUCATION.

9 Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]

10 Subp. 3. Criteria for course approval. For the purpose of
11 this rule, "course sponsor" means any agency, organization, or
12 person who provides continuing education courses and seeks board
13 approval of these courses.

14 A. to G. [Unchanged.]

15 H. The board will approve the course for continuing
16 education credit hours based on each hour of proposed training.
17 An hour shall consist of 50 minutes of learning activities.

22 6700.1000 LICENSE RENEWAL.

23 Subpart 1. to 4. [Unchanged.]

24 Subp. 5. Lapse of license. A license shall lapse when the
25 requirements of subpart 3 are not met.

26 Subp. 6. License lapsed less than three years. The
27 executive director shall restore a license and issue a
28 certificate of renewal for a license which has been lapsed for
29 less than three years when the licensee submits:

30 A. the appropriate license renewal fee for a lapsed
31 license; and

32 B. documentation which shows that the licensee has
33 completed the number of continuing education credits required by
34 subpart 3.

35 Subp. 7. License renewal fee. For the purposes of

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1 subparts 6 and 9, the appropriate license renewal fee for a
2 lapsed license is as follows:

- 3 A. lapsed peace officer license is \$45; or
4 B. lapsed part-time peace officer license is \$37.50;
5 or
6 C. lapsed constable license is \$45.

7 ~~Subp. 8. Continuing education after license is restored.~~
8 ~~Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, after a peace officer~~
9 ~~or constable license has been restored, the licensee shall~~
10 ~~complete 48 hours of continuing education, no more than six of~~
11 ~~which consist of on-line shooting, on or before June 30 of the~~
12 ~~year when the license becomes due for renewal.~~

13 Subp. 9 8. License lapsed more than three years. When a
14 license has been lapsed for more than three years, the executive
15 director shall restore the license when:

- 16 A. the licensee successfully completes the
17 appropriate licensing examination; and
18 B. the licensee submits the appropriate license
19 renewal fee for a lapsed license.

20 Subp. ~~10~~ 9. Licensing examination. For the purposes of
21 subpart 9 8, the appropriate licensing examination is as follows:

- 22 A. the academic and skills licensing examination for
23 a peace officer;
24 B. the part-time peace officer licensing examination
25 for a part-time peace officer; or
26 C. the constable licensing examination for a
27 constable.

28 Subp. 10. Continuing education after license is restored.
29 Notwithstanding any rule to the contrary, after a peace officer
30 or constable license has been restored, the licensee shall
31 complete 48 hours of board-approved continuing education, no
32 more than six of which consist of on-line shooting, on or before
33 June 30 of the year when the license becomes due for renewal.

34 Subp. 11. Appeals. Any contested case which arises from
35 subpart 3, 6, or 9 8 will be processed in accordance with
36 Minnesota Statutes, chapter 14, and the rules of the Office of

1 Administrative Hearings.

2 6700.1600 VIOLATION OF STANDARDS OF CONDUCT.

3 Violations of the following standards of conduct by a
4 licensee shall be grounds for revocation, suspension, or
5 nonrenewal of license:

6 A. the conviction of a felony in this state or in any
7 other state or federal jurisdiction or of any offense in any
8 other state or federal jurisdiction which would have been a
9 felony if committed in Minnesota;

10 B. the use of deadly force when not authorized by
11 Minnesota Statutes, section 609.066;

12 C. the making of any false material statement under
13 oath to the board which the peace officer does not believe to be
14 true;

15 D. the making of any false material statement to the
16 board while obtaining or renewing a license;

17 E. any violation of a board rule set forth in parts
18 6700.0100 to 6700.1900; or

19 F. any obstruction, hindrance, interference, or
20 prevention of the execution of part 6700.1700.

21 6700.1800 REIMBURSEMENT TO LOCAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT.

22 Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]

23 Subp. 3. Share for peace officers working part time. A
24 share may be awarded when a peace officer has worked part-time
25 for a local unit, but only one local unit shall be credited with
26 a share for the same peace officer.

27 Subp. 4. Application forms. The board shall furnish
28 application forms to each local unit as soon as possible after
29 July 1 of each year. When applying for reimbursement, a local
30 unit shall provide a list of the peace officers or
31 constables together with their license numbers for whom it is
32 seeking reimbursement and affirm that it is eligible to be
33 reimbursed in accordance with the board's rules.

34 Subp. 5. Signing of application forms. Application forms
35 shall be signed by both the chief law enforcement officer and

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1 the official designated by resolution of the appointing
2 authority. The forms shall be submitted to the executive
3 director within 60 days of the distribution of the forms, except
4 that the executive director may grant an extension of time which
5 shall not exceed ten days.
