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4 Adopted Rule Relating to School Safety Patrol Members

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6 Rule as Adopted

7 7415.0500 POSITION AND PROCEDURE AT STREET INTERSECTION OR  
8 CROSSING.

9 A school patrol member must comply with the following  
10 procedures at street intersections and crossings:

11 A. to C. [Unchanged.]

12 D. When the lanes of the roadway are clear of traffic  
13 the patrol member shall extend the flag into the traffic lane at  
14 an angle of approximately 45 degrees upward. This will be the  
15 signal for all the children to start crossing the street.  
16 Holding the flag at a 45-degree angle will place it above the  
17 heads of the children. With two patrol members at one  
18 intersection, each member shall make a quarter turn in the  
19 direction of the oncoming traffic and remain as close as  
20 practicable to the curb or shoulder.

21 E. [Unchanged.]

22 F. After the children have completed crossing the  
23 street, the patrol member shall return to the original position  
24 on the shoulder or curb.

25 G. [Unchanged.]

26 H. There shall be one or more patrol members at each  
27 crossing. When two are used, one patrol member shall operate as  
28 the sender on the side from which the children gather, and the  
29 other shall take a similar position on the opposite side of the  
30 roadway and operate as the receiver.

31 I. At least two patrol members shall be used at a  
32 particular crossing when, in the opinion of local law  
33 enforcement officials, traffic or other conditions are such that  
34 more than one patrol member is needed for the safety of the  
35 school children.

36 J. Patrol members shall continually watch oncoming

1 traffic while children are crossing the roadway and be  
2 constantly alert for danger. They shall stand between the  
3 children and approaching traffic and remain as close as  
4 practicable to the curb or shoulder.
