Subpart 1. Scope. The terms used in parts 4900.1700 to 13 14 4900.1703 have the meaning given them in this part. Subp. 2. Agency. "Agency" means the Minnesota Housing 15 16 Finance Agency. Subp. 3. Applicant. "Applicant" means one or more 17 entities that submit an application for a temporary housing 18 19 program grant. 20 Subp. 4. Application. "Application" means a submittal requesting a temporary housing program grant to pay the cost of 21 22 the acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation of a structure 23 to provide temporary housing for low and moderate income persons. 24 Subp. 5. Persons and families of low and moderate income. "Persons and families of low and moderate income" 25 means, with respect to temporary housing program grants, those 26 persons and families whose income does not exceed 50 percent of 27 the statewide median household income as estimated by the United 28 29 States Department of Housing and Urban Development. 30 Subp. 6. Structure. "Structure" means a building to be constructed, acquired, or rehabilitated for use as temporary 31 32 housing. Subp. 7. Support services. "Support services" means an 33

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assessment service that identifies the needs of individuals for

independent living and arranges or provides for the appropriate

educational, social, legal, advocacy, child care, employment, , , 1 financial, or information and referral services to meet these 2 3 needs. 4 Subp. 8. Temporary housing. "Temporary housing" means housing provided for a limited duration not exceeding six months 5 6 and available for occupancy on a continuous 24-hour basis. 7 Subp. 9. Temporary housing program grant or grant. "Temporary housing program grant" or "grant" means an 8 appropriation of money to an eligible applicant under the 9 authority granted in Minnesota Statutes, section 462A.05, 10 subdivision 20. 11 12 4900.1702 ELIGIBILITY. 13 Subpart 1. For applicants. To be eligible for selection 14 for a grant, an applicant shall satisfy the following 15 requirements: 16 Α. The applicant must be a nonprofit entity as 17 defined in part 4900.0010, subpart 21. 18 в. The applicant must provide a comprehensive plan for meeting the existing need for temporary housing and for the 19 20 placement of persons in independent housing. At a minimum this plan must include: 21 22 (1) documentation of a need for temporary housing by the population to be served by the structure; 23 (2) a description of the applicant's goals and 24 25 objectives for meeting the special needs of the population to be 26 served; 27 (3) documentation of an ability to provide 28 support services to assist persons in moving into independent or appropriate supportive living situations; and 29 30 (4) a detailed budget for the first year and projected budgets for future years. 31 32 с. The applicant shall document fiscal responsibility 33 and the ability to complete the construction, acquisition, or 34 modification of the structure and to maintain the structure in accordance with its funded use for a specific period of time. 35 36 Subp. 2. a grant, a proposed temporary housing structure must satisfy the 1 following requirements: 2 The structure must provide temporary housing for 3 Α. persons and families of low and moderate income. 4 The structure must provide a physical environment в. 5 that is responsive to the needs of the population to be served. 6 The structure must comply with applicable state 7 с. and local codes, zoning ordinances, land use provisions, and 8 9 laws. The structure must be located in Minnesota. D. 10 4900.1703 SELECTION CRITERIA FOR GRANTS. 11 The agency shall take the following criteria into 12 consideration when determining which applications will be funded: 13 A. the extent to which the grant is combined with 14 funds or in-kind contributions from other public and private 15 16 sources; the availability and source of funds to pay the 17 в. cost of acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation of the 18 structure not funded by the grant; 19 C. the availability and source of funds to pay the 20 ongoing costs of the support services; 21 the distribution of funds to service a variety of 22 D. populations, including but not limited to, families with 23 children, couples, single persons, and persons leaving a shelter 24 for family abuse; 25 the geographic distribution of the funded 26 Ε. applications within the state; 27 the immediacy of the need documented for temporary . 28 F. housing in the area in which the structure is located; - 29 30 G. the capacity of the applicant to proceed promptly with the acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation of the 31 32 structure; the amount of the grant requested as compared to 33 Η. the total resources available for these grants; 34 I. the extent to which the application receives the 35 support and participation of the local community; 36

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J. the geographic location of the structure in 1 2 relation to support services, recreational facilities, medical facilities, and transportation; 3 K. the reasonableness of the acquisition, 4 construction, or rehabilitation cost with preference given to 5 applications that minimize the cost per temporary housing units 6 produced; 7 L. the extent to which the application uses 8

9 innovative cost-effective support services that are appropriate 10 to the needs of the population served; and

M. the experience of the applicant in developing or managing housing, providing support services, and servicing the specific target population of homeless persons.

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
