- 5 Rules as Adopted
- 6 3100.4100 CONTINUING DENTAL EDUCATION.
- 7 Subpart 1. Evidence of attendance. Each licensee and
- 8 registrant shall provide evidence on forms supplied by the
- 9 board, that the person has attended or participated in CDE as
- 10 required by parts 3100.4100 to 3100.4600.
- 11 Subp. 2. Minimum hours. The minimum number of hours of
- 12 approved CDE for each five years shall be: for dentists, 75
- 13 hours; for dental hygienists, 40 hours; and for registered
- 14 dental assistants, 25 hours. Of these hours, dentists may earn
- 15 no more than 15 hours, dental hygienists no more than eight
- 16 hours, and registered dental assistants no more than five hours
- 17 on nonclinical subjects relating to the dental profession.
- Nonclinical subjects relating to the dental profession are
- 19 those which cover skills related to dental services in general
- 20 which are not directly related to, but are nevertheless
- 21 supportive of, the provision of clinical services. Examples of
- 22 nonclinical subjects relating to the dental profession are
- 23 patient management, the legal and ethical responsibilities of
- 24 the dental profession, and stress management.
- 25 Examples of subjects that are not considered to be related
- 26 to the dental profession are estate planning, financial
- 27 planning, marketing, investments, and personal health.
- 28 Subp. 3. [Unchanged.]
- 29 Subp. 4. Exemptions. A licensee or registrant who pays an
- 30 annual license or registration renewal fee and meets any of the
- 31 following conditions is exempt from complying with the CDE
- 32 requirements if he or she files with the board an affidavit
- 33 specifying the condition within which he or she falls:
- 34 A. resides permanently outside the state and does not
- 35 practice within the state; or
- 36 B. is retired from practice and does not perform any

- l dental services on a volunteer or free basis; or
- C. is permanently disabled and unable to practice
- 3 dentistry.
- 4 Subp. 5. Expiration of exemption. A licensee or
- 5 registrant claiming exemption under subpart 4 who subsequently
- 6 decides to resume practice shall submit to the board, before
- 7 resuming practice, a written notice of the intended change and
- 8 evidence of having completed CDE requirements equivalent to what
- 9 the requirements would have been without the exemption for the
- 10 five years immediately preceding the date of receipt of the
- 11 notice of the intent to resume practice. If the licensee or
- 12 registrant has not complied with the CDE requirements, the
- 13 licensee or registrant must comply with part 3100.1850, subpart
- 14 2, if the licensee or registrant had been exempt from complying
- 15 with CDE requirements for less than five years and with part
- 16 3100.1850, subpart 3, if exempt more than five years. The
- 17 licensee or registrant may not resume practice until notified by
- 18 the board that the evidence submitted is acceptable. The
- 19 licensee or registrant will be placed into the CDE cycle that he
- 20 or she would have been in if the exemption was not claimed.
- 21 3100.4200 CDE SPONSORS.
- 22 Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]
- 23 Subp. 2. Application procedure. Persons or organizations
- 24 intending to offer courses for CDE credit shall present a
- 25 completed application on a form provided by the board. The form
- 26 will request the submission of information which will enable the
- 27 board to determine whether the applicant meets the standards for
- 28 sponsor approval as specified in subpart 5. The board may
- 29 require the submission of any other information it deems
- 30 necessary to determine whether the applicant meets those
- 31 standards. Each application for sponsor approval submitted to
- 32 the board must include the application fee established in part
- 33 3100.2000 before the application will be considered. The board
- 34 may use as a consultant a committee, which may include nonboard
- 35 members, to evaluate sponsor applications.
- 36 Subp. 3. [See repealer.]

- 1 Subp. 4. Sponsor renewal. When the board approves a
- 2 sponsor, the approval will remain in effect for four years. In
- 3 order to remain an approved sponsor, the sponsor must again
- 4 submit an application and fee as provided for in subpart 2 and
- 5 be approved before the expiration of the four-year period.
- 6 Subp. 5. Approval standards. The board will approve as a
- 7 sponsor those applicants which meet the following standards:
- 8 A. The applicant is formally organized as a
- 9 corporation (for profit or not for profit), partnership,
- 10 accredited educational institution, or other formal association
- 11 and has as one of its principal purposes the sponsoring of CDE
- 12 courses.
- B. The courses proposed by a sponsor must have
- 14 significant intellectual or practical content which deal in the
- 15 clinical and scientific aspect of dentistry and patient
- 16 communication or in nonclinical subjects relating to the dental
- 17 profession as specified in part 3100.4100, subpart 2.
- 18 C. [Unchanged.]
- 19 Subp. 6. Proof of participation. Each sponsor, at least
- 20 once during each CDE course sponsored by it, shall announce to
- 21 all participants that in order to receive CDE credit that they
- 22 submit to the sponsor a card supplied by the board within two
- 23 weeks of completion of the course. The sponsor shall submit all
- 24 cards to the board within three weeks after completion of the
- 25 course.
- 26 Subp. 7. [Unchanged.]
- 27 3100.4300 APPROVAL OF COURSES ATTENDED.
- 28 Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]
- 29 Subp. 3. Course approval standards. The board shall grant
- 30 CDE credit for any course which meets the following standards.
- 31 The course shall have significant intellectual or practical
- 32 content dealing in the clinical and scientific aspect of
- 33 dentistry and patient communication, or in nonclinical subjects
- 34 related to the dental profession as specified in part 3100.4100,
- 35 subpart 2.
- 36 Subp. 4. to 6. [Unchanged.]

- 1 3100.4400 ESTABLISHING CREDIT HOURS FOR COURSES.
- 2 For courses presented by sponsors approved pursuant to
- 3 part 3100.4200, and for courses approved pursuant to part
- 4 3100.4300, the board shall fix the number of hours of CDE credit
- 5 based upon the following criteria:
- 6 A. Multiday convention-type meetings such as state or
- 7 national dental conventions or their equivalent will be given
- 8 three clock hours credit.
- 9 B. Scientific or educational meetings or courses or
- 10 similar offerings will be credited on an hour-for-hour basis.
- 11 C. Home study with an accompanying examination will
- 12 be awarded hourly credit if the examination is successfully
- 13 completed based upon a determination by the board or sponsor of
- 14 the reasonable amount of time necessary to cover the material
- 15 and take the examination and not on the basis of the individual
- 16 time taken to study or review the material.
- D. Presentation of a course made on behalf of an
- 18 approved sponsor will be credited on an hour-for-hour basis.
- 19 3100.4600 TIME LIMITS FOR NOTICE OF ATTENDANCE.
- 20 Within two weeks after completing a course given by a
- 21 sponsor approved pursuant to part 3100.4200, the licensee or
- 22 registrant shall fill out the form supplied by the board for
- 23 reporting participation in CDE courses and submit it to the
- 24 sponsor. If a course is taken from a sponsor not approved by
- 25 the board under part 3100.4200, CDE credit for that course will
- 26 not be granted unless the licensee or registrant applies for
- 27 course approval under part 3100.4300 within two weeks after
- 28 completion of the course. If a licensee or registrant fails to
- 29 comply with the time limits specified, the board may refuse to
- 30 grant CDE credit for the applicable course.
