- 8 4830.1550 [Emergency] SCOPE.
- 9 Parts 4830.1550 to 4830.1556 [Emergency] govern state
- 10 grants-in-aid for part-time students.
- 11 4830.1551 [Emergency] ELIGIBLE SCHOOLS.
- Schools eligible for part-time student grants are the same
- 13 schools eligible for state scholarships and grants-in-aid under
- 14 part 4830.0300 [Emergency].
- 15 4830.1552 [Emergency] APPLICATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS FOR
- 16 GRANTS.
- 17 Subpart 1. Allocation formula. The board shall allocate
- 18 funds to each school according to the following formula:
- 19 A. Each school's share is the number of part-time
- 20 students enrolled in the last fiscal year, multiplied by the
- 21 average registration level of its part-time students in the last
- 22 fiscal year, multiplied by the institutional budget used by the
- 23 scholarship and grant-in-aid program for the current fiscal year.
- B. Each school's allocation is:
- 25 (1) the school's share, divided by the sum of
- 26 school shares,
- 27 (2) the result in subitem (1) multiplied by 90
- 28 percent of the total part-time grant allocation for the current
- 29 year.
- 30 C. Each January, the board shall allocate the
- 31 remaining ten percent of the total part-time grant allocation
- 32 according to the same formula, except that current year
- 33 part-time enrollment data and average registration levels may be
- 34 used if the school has submitted by November 15 fall data for
- 35 the current year that is acceptable to the board.

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- D. Funds allocated to institutions for the 1986
- 2 fiscal year before the effective date of parts 4830.1550 to
- 3 4830.1556 [Emergency] shall be deducted from the school's fall

- 5 "Number of part-time students" means the sum of all
- 6 enrolled resident, extension, and unclassified part-time
- 7 students, who are Minnesota residents, and are reported to the
- 8 board for its annual enrollment survey as lower division, upper
- 9 division, and vocational students in the fall term of the school
- 10 year.
- ll "Registration level" is the number of credits (or an
- 12 equivalent measure) taken by part-time students in the fall term
- 13 of the school year as reported to the board for its annual
- 14 enrollment survey, divided by 12 credits (or an equivalent
- 15 measure).
- Subp. 2. Notification. The board shall notify each school
- 17 of the amount allocated to it.
- Subp. 3. Accountability. Each participating school shall
- 19 be accountable for any funds disbursed to students for
- 20 grants-in-aid for part-time students. Funds may be used only
- 21 during the fiscal year of disbursement. If a student does not
- 22 use a grant because the student does not enroll or withdraws
- 23 from school, the school may use the funds for other eligible
- 24 students or return them to the board.
- Subp. 4. Unused funds. When requested by the board, a
- 26 school shall report its use of funds and shall return unused
- 27 funds. The board shall reallocate unused funds to schools

- 29 4830.1553 [Emergency] DETERMINATION OF ELIGIBILITY.
- 30 A school shall determine if a student is eliqible for a
- 31 part-time student grant. To be eligible a student must be an
- 32 eligible student as defined in part 4830.0100, subpart 5, items
- 33 A, B, C, E, and F; except that a post-baccalaureate student
- 34 enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program who enrolled in
- 35 the same course of study and who received a part-time grant
- 36 during the 1984-1985 school year is eligible for a part-time APPROVED IN THE

- l grant in the 1985-1986 school year. The student must also be
- 2 pursuing course work applicable to a degree, diploma, or
- 3 certificate.
- 4 4830.1554 [Emergency] AMOUNT AND TERM OF GRANTS.
- 5 Subpart 1. Financial need. A school shall award a grant
- 6 to each eligible student, to the extent allocated funds are
- 7 available and to the extent the student demonstrates financial
- 8 need according to a method consistent with the institution's
- 9 financial aid policies and procedures.
- 10 Subp. 2. Cost-of-attendance Direct educational cost. The
- ll direct educational cost of-attendance includes, but is not
- 12 limited to the following:
- 13 A. resident tuition and fees at the institution;
- B. educational materials;
- 15 C. transportation expenses; and
- D. an allowance for child care expenses.
- The direct educational cost of-attendance must be
- 18 consistent with the institution's financial aid policies and
- 19 procedures.
- 20 Subp. 3. Amount. The amount of the grant when combined
- 21 with (a) federal, state, institutional, and private financial
- 22 aid grant assistance that the student receives, (b) employer

- 25 must not exceed the student's direct educational cost of

- 27 4830.1555 [Emergency] REPORTS OF DATA.
- The school must collect demographic, educational, and
- 29 financial data specified by the board from eligible students
- 30 requesting grants. The school shall provide the board with
- 31 individual student data upon request.
- 32 4830.1556 [Emergency] TEMPORARY EFFECT.
- 33 While they are in effect, parts 4830.1550 to 4830.1555
- 34 [Emergency] prevail over parts 4830.1000 to 4830.1500.

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
