7 4505.0900 FILING.

8 Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]

9 Subp. 2. Filing of more than one statement in any year.

10 An individual is not required to file more than one statement of
11 economic interest in any year; except that an individual who has
12 filed a statement of economic interest within the calendar year
13 must file a supplementary statement within 14 days after filing
14 an affidavit of candidacy or undertaking the duties of office
15 requiring the advice and consent of the senate.

17 4510.0600 DISCLOSURE OF GIFTS, LOANS, HONORARIUMS, ITEMS, OR
18 BENEFITS.

19 Subpart 1. General requirements. The lobbyist shall
20 report the name and address of each public official receiving
21 any gift, honorarium, loan, item, or benefit from the lobbyist,
22 or any employer or employee of the lobbyist, equal in value to
23 \$50 or more in a single transaction, to include the amount, the
24 date on which it was received, and a description of the
25 transaction, whether or not it was given for lobbying purposes,
26 in the following categories.

28 4510.1300 WAIVER OF LATE FILING FEES.

29 The board shall grant a waiver of a late filing fee if the
30 board is satisfied that the statement or report was not filed on
31 time due to sickness, injury, or other compelling reason upon
32 receipt of a written request for a waiver.

10 4515.0300 APPLICABILITY OF THE CONFLICTS OF INTEREST PROVISIONS.

11 Any public official who, in the discharge of official
12 duties, would be required to take action or make a decision
13 which would substantially affect the official's financial
14 interests, or those of a business with which he is associated,
15 as that term is defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 10A.01,
16 subdivision 4, must file a potential conflict of interest
17 notice, unless the effect on the official is no greater than on
18 other members of the official's business classification,
19 profession, or occupation.

20 4520.0100 DEFINITIONS.

32 day.
