- 19 7045.0552 FACILITIES GOVERNED BY INTERIM STATUS.
- 20 Subpart 1. General requirements. Parts 7045.0552 to
- 21 7045.0642 establish minimum standards for the management of
- 22 hazardous waste during the period of interim status and until
- 23 certification of final closure or, if the facility is subject to
- 24 post-closure requirements, until post-closure responsibilities
- 25 are fulfilled. These standards apply to owners and operators of
- 26 existing facilities who have fully complied with the
- 27 requirements for state or federal interim status until a permit
- 28 is issued or until applicable interim status closure and
- 29 post-closure responsibilities are fulfilled, and those who have
- 30 failed to achieve state or federal interim status. These
- 31 standards apply to all treatment, storage, or disposal of
- 32 hazardous waste at these facilities after July 16, 1984, except
- 33 as specifically provided otherwise.
- 34 For existing facilities which were not required to obtain
- 35 federal interim status under the Resource Conservation and

- 1 Recovery Act, United States Code, title 42, sections 6901 to
- 2 6986, as amended through June 30, 1983, but are required to
- 3 obtain state interim status, the requirements of parts
- 4 7045.0590; 7045.0592; 7045.0632, subpart 4, items A and B;
- 5 7045.0634, subpart 2; 7045.0638, subparts 2, 7, and 8, become
- 6 effective 12 months after July 16, 1984, and the requirements of
- 7 parts 7045.0608 to 7045.0624 become effective 90 days after July
- 8 16, 1984.

- 10 7045.0638 LANDFILLS.
- 11 Subpart 1. to 3. [Unchanged.]
- 12 Subp. 4. Closure and post-closure. Closure and
- 13 post-closure requirements are as follows:
- 14 A. At final closure of the landfill or upon closure
- 15 of any landfill cell, the owner or operator shall cover the
- 16 landfill or landfill cell with a final cover designed and
- 17 constructed to:
- 18 (1) provide long-term minimization of migration
- 19 of liquids through the closed landfill;
- 20 (2) function with minimum maintenance;
- 21 (3) promote drainage and minimize erosion or
- 22 abrasion of the cover;
- 23 (4) accommodate settling and subsidence so that
- ' 24 the cover's integrity is maintained; and
 - 25 (5) have a permeability less than or equal to the
 - 26 permeability of any bottom liner system or natural subsoils
 - 27 present.
 - 28 B. After final closure, the owner or operator shall
 - 29 comply with all post-closure requirements contained in parts
 - 30 7045.0600 to 7045.0606 including maintenance and monitoring
 - 31 throughout the post-closure care period. The owner or operator
 - 32 must:
 - 33 (1) maintain the integrity and effectiveness of
 - 34 the final cover, including making repairs to the cover as
 - 35 necessary to correct the effect of settling, subsidence,
 - 36 erosion, or other events;

(2) maintain and monitor the ground water 1 monitoring system and comply with all other applicable 2 3 requirements of parts 7045.0590 and 7045.0592; 4 (3) prevent run-on and run-off from eroding or otherwise damaging the final cover; and 5 6 (4) protect and maintain surveyed bench marks 7 used in complying with part 7045.0638, subpart 3. 8 Subp. 5. to 7. [Unchanged.] Subp. 8. Special requirements for containers. Unless they 9 are very small, such as an ampule, containers must be either: 10 A. at least 90 percent full when placed in the 11 landfill; or 12 13 B. crushed, shredded, or similarly reduced in volume to the maximum practical extent before burial in the landfill. 14 Subp. 9.
