 6 Rules as Adopted

7 4625.2300 INITIAL AND RENEWAL LICENSE FEES, LICENSE EXPIRATION
 8 DATES.

9 Subpart 1. Fee schedule. License applications for lodging
 10 establishments as defined in part 4625.0100 shall be accompanied
 11 by a fee of \$50 plus \$2 per room, up to a maximum total fee of
 12 \$250.

13 4625.5000 INITIAL AND RENEWAL LICENSE FEES, LICENSE EXPIRATION
 14 DATES.

15 Subpart 1. Fee schedule. Initial and renewal license
 16 applications for food and beverage establishments as defined in
 17 part 4625.2400 shall be accompanied by the applicable fee as
 18 determined from the schedule below. The average number of
 19 employees shall be computed in accordance with Minnesota
 20 Statutes, section 157.03.

- 21 A. one to four employees, \$52.50;
- 22 B. five to 18, \$90;
- 23 C. 19 to 28, \$135;
- 24 D. 29 to 35, \$187.50;
- 25 E. 36 and over, \$225; and
- 26 F. limited or temporary food service, \$37.50.

27 4630.2000 FEE SCHEDULE FOR LICENSES.

28 The application for a primary license, or a renewal
 29 thereof, to operate a mobile home park or recreational camping
 30 area, as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 327.14, shall be
 31 accompanied by the following fees:

- 32 A. Primary (initial) license fee: \$75 for each 50
 33 sites or fraction thereof. The fee for additional sites
 34 proposed after a primary license has been issued shall be \$75



1 for each 50 sites or fraction thereof.

2 B. Renewal fee for year-round establishments: \$15
3 for each ten sites or fraction thereof with a maximum fee of
4 \$300 except as provided for in item D.

5 C. Renewal fee for seasonal establishments: the
6 renewal fee for any mobile home park or recreational camping
7 area which operates for a continuous period of six months (183
8 days) or less during a calendar year shall pay 75 percent of the
9 fee as computed pursuant to item B with a maximum fee of \$225
10 except as provided for in item D.

11 D. Increased fee: for year-round operations, the fee
12 will be increased by \$10 if the renewal application and fee are
13 not submitted by January 15 of the year for which application
14 for license is made. For seasonal operations the fee will be
15 increased \$10 if the renewal application and fee are not
16 submitted within 15 calendar days after the establishment opens.

17 4695.2900 APPLICATION FEES.

18 Fees to be submitted with initial or renewal applications
19 shall be as follows:

20 A. Initial application fee, \$45 plus examination fees.

21 B. Biennial renewal application fee, \$45.

22 C. Penalty for late submission of renewal
23 application, \$10, if not renewed by designated renewal date.

24 4715.3150 FEES.

25 Subpart 1. Fees for examination. Applications to take the
26 journeyman or master plumber's examination shall be submitted to
27 the commissioner of health on forms provided together with a fee
28 of \$30.

29 Subp. 2. Fees for license. Any applicant who receives a
30 passing grade on the examination may submit an application for
31 license on forms provided by the commissioner of health. The
32 application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$45 for a
33 journeyman plumber's license or \$80 for a master plumber's
34 license.

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1 4715.3160 EXPIRATION OF LICENSES.

2 Subpart 1. Issuance and expiration. Initial and renewal
3 journeyman and master plumber's licenses shall be issued for the
4 calendar year for which application is made and shall expire on
5 December 31 of such year. Any journeyman or master plumber who
6 submits his renewal application after December 31 shall not work
7 as a journeyman or master plumber until he has submitted an
8 application, fee, and penalty fee. Any licensee who does not
9 renew his license within two years is no longer eligible for
10 renewal. Such person must retake and pass the examination
11 before a new license will be issued.

12 Subp. 2. License renewals. Applications for license
13 renewal shall be submitted to the commissioner of health on
14 forms provided no later than December 31 of the year preceding
15 the year for which application is made. The application shall
16 be accompanied by a fee of \$45 for a journeyman plumber and \$80
17 for a master plumber. Journeyman and master plumbers who submit
18 their license renewal applications after the time specified in
19 subpart 1 but within two years after expiration of the
20 previously issued license shall pay all past due renewal fees
21 plus an additional \$8.

22 Subp. 3. Fee for filing bond and insurance. Master
23 plumbers who file a bond and evidence of liability insurance
24 with the secretary of state, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes,
25 section 326.40, shall pay an additional fee of \$40.

26 4715.5900 FEES.

27 Subpart 1. Examination fee. The fee for application for
28 examination or reexamination shall be \$30 for a water
29 conditioning installer, and \$30 for a water conditioning
30 contractor. Only fees from persons who do not qualify for
31 examination will be returned.

32 Subp. 2. License fee. The fee for a new license or for
33 renewal of an existing license shall be as follows: water
34 conditioning installer, \$30; water conditioning contractor, \$50.

35 Subp. 3. Fee for filing bond and insurance. Water

1 conditioning contractors who file a bond and evidence of
2 liability insurance with the secretary of state, pursuant to
3 Minnesota Statutes, section 326.601, shall pay an additional fee
4 of \$40.

5 4720.0015 FEES FOR REVIEW OF PLANS.

6 All plans for water supply system construction, alteration,
7 or extension submitted for review and approval to the Department
8 of Health as required in part 4720.0010 shall be accompanied by
9 the appropriate fees, as prescribed below:

- 10 A. Watermains, \$150;
- 11 B. Wells, \$250;
- 12 C. Pumphouses, \$150;
- 13 D. Chemical feed, \$150;
- 14 E. Treatment plants (new), \$1,000;
- 15 F. Treatment plants (renovation), \$250;
- 16 G. Storage (installation), \$300;
- 17 H. Storage (coating), \$100; and
- 18 I. Booster stations, \$150.

19 The appropriate fees shall be paid by check made payable to
20 "~~Treasurer~~, State of Minnesota Department of Health."

21 4730.0600 REGISTRATION FEES.

22 Subpart 1. Fee for initial or renewal registration. The
23 initial or renewal biennial registration of every source of
24 ionizing radiation required to be registered by parts 4730.0400
25 to 4730.0800 shall be accompanied by a fee as prescribed
26 herein. The fee shall be based upon the number of X-ray tubes
27 and facilities using radium registered by each person, company,
28 hospital, group, practice, or other organization or association
29 at one general site as follows:

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7 ¹ Medical source means X-ray equipment used by any licensed
8 practitioner of the healing arts and facilities with which they
9 are associated, but does not include sources used by dentists.

10 ² Industrial or educational source means X-ray equipment used in
11 an industrial or educational facility.

12 Subp. 2. Penalty fee. Applications for initial or renewal
13 registrations submitted to the commissioner of health after the
14 time specified by part 4715.3160 and this part shall be
15 accompanied by a penalty fee of \$15 in addition to the fee
16 prescribed in subpart 1.

17 Subp. 3. Fee for sources requiring registration during
18 last three months of a biennial registration. The initial
19 registration fee for any source of ionizing radiation required
20 to be registered during the last three months of a biennial
21 registration period shall be \$10 per X-ray tube up to a maximum
22 of 16 tubes and \$20 for each facility using radium. The
23 inspection surcharge for any X-ray or accelerator facility shall
24 be \$10. The penalty fees as specified in subpart 2 shall apply
25 to this subpart. This provision shall not apply to any
26 application for registration which should have been submitted to
27 the commissioner of health in a timely manner prior to the last
28 three months of a registration period.
