- 6 1555.0005 DEFINITIONS.
- 7 Subpart 1. Scope. The definitions in subparts 2 to 13
- 8 apply to parts 1555.0005 to 1555.0012.
- 9 Subp. 2. Certification. "Certification" means the process
- 10 by which an organization, business, or firm concerned with
- ll production, processing, distribution, or general promotion of
- 12 organic foods verifies that a given farm or processor meets that
- 13 organization's standards.
- Subp. 3. Department. "Department" means the Minnesota
- 15 Department of Agriculture.
- 16 Subp. 4. Drug. "Drug" means an article intended for use
- 17 in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of
- 18 disease in animals other than man and articles other than feed
- 19 intended to affect the structure or any function of an animal's
- 20 body.
- 21 Subp. 5. Fertilizer material. "Fertilizer material" means
- 22 a substance containing nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium, or a
- 23 recognized plant food nutrient, or a compound which is used
- 24 primarily for its plant nutrient content or for compounding
- 25 mixed fertilizers except unmanipulated animal and vegetable
- 26 manures.
- 27 Subp. 6. Horticultural oils. "Horticultural oils" means a
- 28 highly refined paraffinic petroleum product made solely for use
- 29 on plants at specific dosages to act as an insecticide or
- 30 miticide.
- 31 Subp. 7. Natural organic fertilizer. "Natural organic
- 32 fertilizer" means materials derived from either plant or animal
- 33 products containing one or more elements (other than carbon,
- 34 hydrogen, and oxygen) which are essential for plant growth.
- 35 These materials may be subjected to biological degradation

- l processes under normal conditions of aging, rainfall, sun
- 2 curing, air drying, composting, rotting, enzymatic or anaerobic
- 3 or aerobic bacterial action, or any combination of these. These
- 4 materials must not be mixed with synthetic materials or changed
- 5 in any physical or chemical manner from their initial state
- 6 except by physical manipulation such as drying, cooking,
- 7 chopping, grinding, shredding, or pelleting.
- 8 Subp. 8. Pesticide. "Pesticide" means a substance or
- 9 mixture of substances intended for preventing, destroying,
- 10 repelling, or mitigating a pest, and a substance or mixture of
- 11 substances intended for use as a plant regulator, defoliant, or
- 12 desiccant.
- 13 Subp. 9. Plant amendment. "Plant amendment" means a
- 14 substance applied to plants or seeds which is intended to
- 15 improve conditions which facilitate germination, growth, yield,
- 16 product quality, reproduction, flavor, or other desirable
- 17 characteristics of plants except commercial fertilizers, soil
- 18 amendments, agricultural liming materials, animal and vegetable
- 19 manures, and pesticides.
- Subp. 10. Soap. "Soap" means fatty acids and their salts
- 21 if the fatty acid occurs in nature.
- Subp. 11. Soil amendment. "Soil amendment" means (1) an
- 23 aggregant, additive, or organic chemical substances, (2) a
- 24 chemically or physically modified natural substance, (3) a
- 25 naturally occurring substance, or (4) a manufacturing
- 26 by-product, mixed or unmixed, which is represented as having a
- 27 primary function of forming or stabilizing soil aggregants in
- 28 soil to which it is to be applied and thereby improving the
- 29 resistance of the soil to the slaking action of water,
- 30 increasing its water and air permeability, improving the
- 31 resistance of its surface to crusting, improving its ease of
- 32 cultivation, or otherwise favorably modifying its structural or
- 33 physical properties.
- 34 Subp. 12. Synthetic. "Synthetic" means a complex compound
- 35 artificially produced usually by chemical synthesis of elements
- 36 or simple compounds.

- Subp. 13. Verification. "Verification" means a procedure
- 2 by which a certifying body determines that foods represented as
- 3 organic are in compliance with their standards through the use
- 4 of questionaires, affidavits, farm inspections, residue tests,
- 5 record audits, or other procedures.
- 6 1555.0006 ORGANIC FOOD REQUIREMENTS.
- 7 Food for which the terms "organic food," "organically grown
- 8 food," or a derivative of the word "organic" are used must be
- 9 food which:
- 10 A. was produced, harvested, cleaned, stored,
- 11 transported, distributed, processed, and packaged without the
- 12 use of artificial irradiation, synthetic pesticides, synthetic
- 13 plant or soil amendments, or fertilizer materials except natural
- 14 organic fertilizers or as specifically allowed in part 1555.0007;
- B. contains no added artificial coloring, artificial
- 16 flavoring, or artificial preservative;
- 17 C. in the case of perennial crops, was grown in soil
- 18 or growth medium free of synthetic pesticides, synthetic soil
- 19 and plant amendments, and synthetic fertilizer materials, except
- 20 as specifically allowed in part 1555.0007, for three years
- 21 before and throughout the entire growing and harvesting season
- 22 of the crop;
- D. in the case of annual crops and two-year crops,
- 24 was grown in soil free of synthetic pesticides, synthetic soil
- 25 and plant amendments, and synthetic fertilizer materials, except
- 26 as allowed in part 1555.0007, for three years before planting or
- 27 transplanting and throughout the entire growing and harvesting
- 28 of the crop;
- 29 E. in the case of meat, poultry, wild or domesticated
- 30 game, shell fish, other nonplant life, or fish, was raised for
- 31 at least the final 60 percent of its sale weight:
- 32 (1) on food produced in conformity with item C or
- 33 D;
- 34 (2) without the application of any synthetic
- 35 pesticides or drugs;

- 1 (3) in a habitat for growth or culture that has
- 2 been free of synthetic fertilizers, pesticides, hormones,
- 3 antibiotics, growth stimulants, and arsenicals for at least
- 4 three years, except as allowed in part 1555.0007;
- 5 (4) without any drug or synthetic pesticides
- 6 administered or introduced by any method, except for treatment
- 7 of a specific disease or malady as diagnosed by a veterinarian
- 8 not less than 90 days before the slaughter for meat, poultry,
- 9 wild or domestic game, shell fish, other nonplant life, or fish;
- 10 and
- Il F. in the case of milk or eggs, was produced by
- 12 animals raised in accordance with item E, except that no
- 13 synthetic pesticide or drug was administered or introduced less
- 14 than 30 days before the production of the milk or eggs.
- 15 1555.0007 EXCEPTIONS.
- Exceptions to part 1555.0006 include:
- A. enzyme sources;
- B. cultures of living or killed microorganisms;
- 19 C. bordeaux mixtures;
- D. elemental sulfur and lime sulfur;
- 21 E. gypsum;
- F. diatomaceous earth;
- G. basic copper sulfate;
- 24 H. horticultural oils;
- I. fish emulsion that is not synthetically produced;
- 26 J. soap;
- 27 K. naturally occurring mineral materials that are not
- 28 chemically modified;
- 29 L. botanically derived pesticides containing no other
- 30 active pesticidal ingredient, which are not synthetically
- 31 produced but which may contain synthetic compounds such as
- 32 emulsifiers, synergists, and carriers; and
- 33 M. pesticide or other toxic chemical residues, not to
- 34 exceed ten percent of the tolerance established by the United
- 35 States Food and Drug Administration or Environmental Protection

- 1 Agency.
- 2 1555.0008 TREATED SEED, TRANSPLANTS AND PROPAGATING PARTS.
- 3 Subpart 1. Organic food producers. If organic food
- 4 producers wish to purchase and use treated seed, treated
- 5 transplants, or treated propagating parts, they must submit a
- 6 written statement to the department that useable untreated seed
- 7 transplants or propagating parts of the desired kind or variety
- 8 are not available. A record of the purchase, including the kind
- 9 and amount of seed, variety if any, the name and address of the
- 10 seller and the date of purchase, must be maintained by the
- 11 producer for three years after the crop is harvested.
- 12 Subp. 2. Certified organic food producers. If certified
- 13 organic food producers wish to purchase and use treated seed,
- 14 treated transplants, or treated propagating parts, they must
- 15 submit a written statement to the certifying agency at the time
- 16 of certification that useable untreated seed transplants or
- 17 propagating parts of the desired kind or variety are not
- 18 available. A record of the purchase, including the kind and
- 19 amount of seed, variety if any, the name and address of the
- 20 seller and the date of purchase, must be maintained by the
- 21 producer for three years after the crop is harvested.
- 22 1555.0009 RECORDS.
- 23 Subpart 1. Producer. A producer who sells food derived
- 24 from a crop which the producer has grown and which is identified
- 25 as organic, organically grown, or by a derivative of the word
- 26 "organic," shall accurately keep the following records: year
- 27 and type of crop; location of the acreage used for growing that
- 28 crop; additions made to the soil or applied to that crop; use of
- 29 any treated seed, treated transplants, or treated propagating
- 30 parts; and quantity, date, and acreage harvested. These records
- 31 must be retained for three years after the food is sold and
- 32 delivered by the producer.
- 33 Subp. 2. Processors and manufacturers. A person who
- 34 processes or manufactures a food which is sold or identified as
- 35 organic, organically grown, or by a derivative of the word

- 1 "organic," shall keep accurate records of the ingredients of
- 2 that food, the names and addresses of persons from whom the
- 3 ingredients were purchased, the date and quantity of ingredients
- 4 purchased, and copies of invoices. These records must be
- 5 retained for three years after the food is sold and delivered.
- 6 Subp. 3. Vendors. A person who sells a food subject to
- 7 subpart 1 or 2, shall keep accurate records of the names and
- 8 addresses of persons from whom that food was purchased, the date
- 9 and quantity of food purchased, and copies of invoices. These
- 10 records must be retained for three years after the food is sold
- ll and delivered.
- 12 Subp. 4. Provision of information. A producer, processor,
- 13 manufacturer, or vendor of food subject to subpart 1, 2, or 3
- 14 shall provide the department, on demand, relevant information
- 15 from the records required under this part.
- 16 1555.0010 INSPECTION AUTHORITY.
- 17 The department may inspect at reasonable times an area
- 18 where food identified, labeled, or advertised as organic,
- 19 organically grown, or by a derivative of the word "organic," is
- 20 grown, processed, manufactured, stored, or sold.
- 21 1555.0011 CERTIFICATION OR VERIFICATION.
- No food which is identified, labeled, or advertised as
- 23 organic, organically grown, or by a derivative of the word
- 24 "organic," may be identified, labeled, or advertised as
- 25 "certified" or "verified" unless the name of the person or
- 26 organization that provides that certification or verification is
- 27 stated on any identification, label, or advertisement.
- 28 1555.0012 PROHIBITIONS.
- No claim or implication may be made in the identification,
- 30 labeling, advertising, or promotion of a food product, including
- 31 processed food products, that the food product is organic,
- 32 organically grown, or by a derivative of the word "organic,"
- 33 unless the product, including all of its ingredients, conforms
- 34 to the requirements of parts 1555.0005 to 1555.0012.

- 1 Food that contains one or more organic ingredients may
- 2 contain an information statement on the label, such as:
- 3 "Contains organic rye flour," in letters not to exceed one-half
- 4 the height of the letters used in the product identity. The
- 5 word "organic" also must precede the name of each organic
- 6 ingredient identified in the list of ingredients.

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- 8 EFFECTIVE DATE. Parts 1555.0005 to 1555.0010 become
- 9 effective March 1, 1988. Parts 1555.0011 and 1555.0012 become
- 10 effective September 1, 1988.
