3 Adopted Rules Relating to Youth Employment Opportunity

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5 Rules as Adopted

6 3300.0100 DEFINITION OF TERMS.

7 Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]

8 Subp. 3. **Commissioner.** "Commissioner" means the
9 commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Jobs and Training.

10 Subp. 4. [Unchanged.]

11 Subp. 5. **Department.** "Department" means the Minnesota
12 Department of Jobs and Training.

13 Subp. 7. [Unchanged.]

14 Subp. 9. **Support services.** "Support services" means
15 services which are necessary to enable an eligible individual to
16 participate in employment funded under the act.

17 3300.0300 ALLOCATION OF FUNDS.

18 Subpart 1. **Allocations to counties.** The commissioner
19 shall allocate funds available under the act as follows:

20 A. Fifty percent of the funds available under the act
21 shall be allocated to counties on the basis of each county's
22 share of the estimated youth population of the state which is
23 from the ages of 14 years up to but not including 22 years.

24 B. Fifty percent of the funds available under the act
25 shall be allocated to counties according to each county's share
26 of the estimated youth population of the state which is from the
27 ages of 14 years up to but not including 22 years, adjusted for:

29 (2) the county's poverty ratio based upon the
30 percent of children from five to 17 years of age living in
31 families below the poverty line as evidenced by the most recent
32 United States Census figures as adjusted by reference to more
33 recent population surveys, provided that reference to more
34 recent population surveys shall be made only if such data is
35 available for all counties in the state.

2 3300.0400 CONTRACTING.

3 The commissioner may enter into contracts for operation of
4 the program with organizations enumerated in part 3300.0100,
5 subpart 4. Selection of contractors with experience in
6 administering summer youth employment programs will be
7 determined by the commissioner taking into consideration
8 recommendations made by local service units. The commissioner
9 may also consider recommendations by other organizations with
10 experience in operating summer youth programs.

11 3300.0601 SUPPORT SERVICES.

12 Using funds allocated under the act, contractors shall
13 provide or arrange for support services for eligible youth. The
14 cost of the support services must not exceed ten percent of the
15 contract. The services may include transportation, meals,
16 career information training, work-related protective devices,
17 and other normal expenses associated with employment funded
18 under the act.
