- 7 6500.0100 DEFINITIONS.
- 8 Subpart 1. Scope. The terms used in this chapter have the
- 9 meanings given them in this part.
- 10 Subp. 2. Act. "Act" means the Minnesota Optometric
- 11 Practice Act, Minnesota Statutes, sections 148.52 to 148.62.
- 12 Subp. 3. Board. "Board" means the Minnesota Board of
- 13 Optometry.
- Subp. 4. Clinical rounds. "Clinical rounds" means a group
- 15 of people sponsored by a clinic or a hospital assembled for
- 16 discussion of information.
- 17 Subp. 5. Contact hour equivalents. "Contact hour
- 18 equivalents" means the number of hours of home study equivalent
- 19 to one hour of continuing education credit.
- 20 Subp. 6. Home study. "Home study" means the utilization
- 21 of educational programs and materials outside the classroom
- 22 setting.
- 23 6500.0150 CONTINUING EDUCATION.
- Subpart 1. Home study and contact hours. Licensees may
- 25 acquire nine hours of continuing education credits through home
- 26 study in each three-year compliance period. Licensees may earn
- 27 continuing education credits through contact hour equivalents.
- 28 One contact hour is equivalent to one continuing education
- 29 credit. Contact hour equivalents include:
- 30 A. Licensees may utilize self-instruction components
- 31 presented in vision care periodicals, audio, and audio-visual
- 32 taped programs, and other program materials specifically
- 33 designed for self-instruction. All programs must include a
- 34 self-test. One contact hour may be earned for each hour of
- 35 self-instruction activity. Contact hours may include both the

- 1 instructional and testing activity.
- B. The presentation of a lecture before an audience
- 3 of optometric or other health professionals will result in one
- 4 contact hour for each hour of presentation. For one time only,
- 5 the lecturer can also acquire two contact hours for preparation
- 6 of the lecture for each hour of presentation. A syllabus or
- 7 lecture manuscript shall be furnished to the board to document
- 8 the presented program.
- 9 C. Licensees may earn continuing education credits
- 10 for the preparation of articles accepted for publication in
- 11 optometric journals or other health-related journals and for the
- 12 preparation of books accepted for publication. A maximum of
- 13 three hours of continuing education credits will be granted for
- 14 acceptance and publication of articles in optometric or
- 15 health-related journals. A maximum of nine hours of continuing
- 16 education credits will be granted for acceptance and publication
- 17 of books on optometry-related subjects.
- D. Each hour spent in clinical rounds will be granted
- 19 one contact hour equivalent.
- 20 Subp. 2. Approval of other home study programs. Upon
- 21 written request, the board may approve the use of home study
- 22 methods not listed in subpart 1, and may determine the number of
- 23 earned contact hours. Board approval will be determined on the
- 24 following criteria:
- A. Whether or not the program is likely to contribute
- 26 to the advancement and extension of professional skill and
- 27 knowledge in the practice of optometry.
- 28 B. Whether the sponsor or author of the program is
- 29 recognized by the board as being qualified to design a program
- 30 of home study in the field of optometry.
- 31 C. As a condition of approval of a program of
- 32 self-instruction, the board may require that the author,
- 33 sponsor, or licensee furnish the board with copies of
- 34 instructional materials and testing tools.
- 35 6500.2700 OPTOMETRIST EMERITUS REGISTRATION.

- Subpart 1. Application. Any optometrist duly licensed to
- 2 practice optometry in Minnesota pursuant to Minnesota Statutes,
- 3 sections 148.52 to 148.62 who declares that he or she is retired
- 4 from active practice of optometry may apply to the board for
- 5 emeritus registration on the annual license renewal form. To
- 6 qualify, the optometrist must be retired and must not be subject
- 7 to any disciplinary action or be subject to an order of the
- 8 board imposing a suspended, conditional, or restricted license
- 9 to practice optometry.
- 10 Subp. 2. Status of registrant. The emeritus registration
- 11 is not a license which permits the registrant to practice
- 12 optometry as defined in Minnesota Statutes, sections 148.52 to
- 13 148.62, and the rules of the board.
- Subp. 3. Continuing education. The continuing education
- 15 requirements of part 6500.0900 are not applicable to emeritus
- 16 registration.
- 17 Subp. 4. Change to active status. The emeritus
- 18 optometrist must:
- A. apply to the board for reinstatement of his or her
- 20 active license; and
- B. comply with the continuing education requirements
- 22 for the time period in which the license was in emeritus
- 23 status. This requirement must be fulfilled prior to petitioning
- 24 the board for reinstatement of license.
- Subp. 5. Renewal cycle or fees. Being registered as an
- 26 emeritus optometrist will not subject the person to the annual
- 27 license renewal cycle or renewal fee.
