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3 Adopted Permanent Rules Relating to Importing Feeding Cattle

6 1700.1500 IMPORTING FEEDING CATTLE.

7 Feeding cattle may be imported as follows: steers, spayed
8 heifers, and calves under six months of age must be listed on a
9 health certificate but need not be identified or tested; heifers
10 of beef type and breed under 18 months of age must be listed on
11 a health certificate but need not be identified or tested
12 provided a permit is secured from the board. Cattle of this
13 class imported from states classified with "B" or "C" status by
14 Veterinary Services, United States Department of Agriculture,
15 must be branded on the jaw with a hot iron with the letter "F"
16 at least two inches high. The cattle must be segregated from
17 all other cattle except steers, spayed heifers, like quarantined
18 cattle, or cattle purchased in accordance with a feeder
19 affidavit quarantine as provided in parts 1705.0060 to
20 1705.0540. Segregation shall consist of a drylot with no
21 pasturing and grazing and double fencing to prevent access to
22 drainage and other cattle. The cattle may be: retained in a
23 feedlot for a period not to exceed 12 months; sold for further
24 feeding under feeder affidavit quarantine as provided in parts
25 1705.0060 to 1705.0540; sold for slaughter; or moved to another
26 state providing the movement is in compliance with state and
27 federal regulations.

28 Upon application by the owner of quarantined cattle that
29 originated in states classified "A" or "Free" by Veterinary
30 Services, United States Department of Agriculture, the board at
31 its discretion may grant permission to the owner to make the
32 necessary tests at the owner's expense to relieve the
33 quarantine. In no case shall the requirements for tests be less
34 than the tests required for breeding cattle.
