6 1700.1500 IMPORTING FEEDING CATTLE.

7 Feeding cattle may be imported as follows: steers, spayed heifers, and calves under six months of age must be listed on a 8 health certificate but need not be identified or tested; heifers 9 of beef type and breed under 18 months of age must be listed on 10 a health certificate but need not be identified or tested 11 provided a permit is secured from the board. Cattle of this 12 class imported from states classified with "B" or "C" status by 13 Veterinary Services, United States Department of Agriculture, 14 must be branded on the jaw with a hot iron with the letter "F" 15 at least two inches high. The cattle must be segregated from 16 all other cattle except steers, spayed heifers, like quarantined 17 18 cattle, or cattle purchased in accordance with a feeder affidavit quarantine as provided in parts 1705.0060 to 19 1705.0540. Segregation shall consist of a drylot with no 20 pasturing and grazing and double fencing to prevent access to 21 22 drainage and other cattle. The cattle may be: retained in a feedlot for a period not to exceed 12 months; sold for further 23 feeding under feeder affidavit quarantine as provided in parts 24 1705.0060 to 1705.0540; sold for slaughter; or moved to another 25 state providing the movement is in compliance with state and 26 27 federal regulations.

Upon application by the owner of quarantined cattle that originated in states classified "A" or "Free" by Veterinary Services, United States Department of Agriculture, the board at its discretion may grant permission to the owner to make the necessary tests at the owner's expense to relieve the quarantine. In no case shall the requirements for tests be less than the tests required for breeding cattle.
