7 5225.0300 EXPIRATION AND RENEWALS.

8 Subpart 1. Timing. Licenses for engineers and pilots,
9 unless revoked, are valid for a period of one year from the date
10 of issuance, with privilege of renewal without examination upon
11 application to the Department of Labor and Industry, Boiler
12 Inspection Division, and payment of a renewal fee within ten
13 calendar days of the expiration date. The renewal license must
14 be given a consecutive issue number and the same monthly date as
15 the original issue. An application for renewal may not be
16 presented before 30 days preceding the expiration date of the
17 license. Engineers who fail to renew their licenses before the
18 ten-day grace period has expired are subject to subparts 2 and 3.

19 Subp. 2. Renewal application within one year of expiration.
20 A license that expired within one year of application for
21 renewal may be renewed without an examination on filing an
22 application for renewal, accompanied by the expired renewal fee
23 required in part 5225.8600.

24 Subp. 3. Renewal application beyond one year of expiration.
25 A license that expired more than one year before the date of
26 application for renewal may be renewed by filing an application
27 for renewal, accompanied by the fee required by part 5225.8600,
28 subpart 2, item C, and passing the examination required by part
29 5225.0500.

30 5225.8600 FEES.

31 Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]

32 Subp. 2. Engineer licenses.

33 A. The fees for a new boiler operating engineer
34 license, application, and examination are as follows:

35 (1) chief engineer, \$50;

- 1 (2) first class engineer, \$30;
- 2 (3) second class engineer, \$25;
- 3 (4) special engineer, \$20;
- 4 (5) hobby engineer, \$50; and
- 5 (6) pilot, \$30.

6 B. The fees for license renewal under part 5225.0300
7 are as follows:

- 8 (1) chief engineer, \$25;
- 9 (2) first class engineer, \$20;
- 10 (3) second class engineer, \$15;
- 11 (4) special engineer, \$10; and
- 12 (5) pilot, \$10.

13 C. The fees for expired renewals under part
14 5225.0300, subpart 2, are as follows:

- 15 (1) chief engineer, \$50;
- 16 (2) first class engineer, \$30;
- 17 (3) second class engineer, \$25;
- 18 (4) special engineer, \$20; and
- 19 (5) pilot, \$30.

20 D. The fee for replacement of a lost license of any
21 class is \$15.

22 Subp. 3. Boiler and pressure vessel inspection. The fees
23 for the annual inspections of boilers and the biennial
24 inspections of pressure vessels under Minnesota Statutes,
25 section 183.545, subdivision 3, are as follows:

- 26 A. boiler inaccessible for internal inspection, \$30;
- 27 B. boiler accessible for internal inspection, \$45;
- 28 C. boiler internal inspection over 2,000 square feet,
29 \$60;
- 30 D. boiler internal inspection over 4,000 square feet,
31 \$75;
- 32 E. boiler internal inspection over 10,000 square
33 feet, \$100;
- 34 F. boiler requiring internal inspection up to
35 one-half day, \$170;
- 36 G. pressure vessel for internal inspection, \$30; and

1 H. pressure vessel inaccessible for internal
2 inspection, \$20.

3 Subp. 4. Shop inspections. The fees for shop inspections
4 under Minnesota Statutes, section 183.545, subdivision 3, are as
5 follows:

6 A. inspection of two hours or less, \$90; supervisor,
7 \$115;

8 B. one-half day, four hours or less, \$170;
9 supervisor, \$220;

10 C. eight hours or less, \$300; supervisor, \$350; and

11 D. each hour over eight hours, per hour, \$50;
12 supervisor, \$75.

13 Subp. 5. Inspectors. The fees for inspector's
14 examinations, certificates, and endorsements under Minnesota
15 Statutes, section 183.545, subdivisions 6, 7, and 8, are as
16 follows:

17 A. national board inspector's exam, \$75;

18 B. endorsement, \$30;

19 C. Minnesota certificate of competency, original,
20 \$30; and

21 D. Minnesota certificate of competency, renewal, \$20.

22 Subp. 6. Exemption certificates. The fee for an exemption
23 certificate under Minnesota Statutes, section 183.57,
24 subdivision 2, is \$10 for each object inspected.

25 Subp. 7. Vessel inspections. The fees for vessel
26 inspections under Minnesota Statutes, section 183.545,
27 subdivision 1, are as follows:

28 A. boat under 30 feet, \$50;

29 B. boat from 30 to no more than 40 feet, \$60;

30 C. boat over 40 to no more than 50 feet, \$70; and

31 D. boat over 50 feet, \$80.

32 Subp. 8. Hobby boilers. The inspection fee for hobby
33 boilers or traction boilers, not previously certified in
34 Minnesota is \$75. The inspection fee for an inspection of a
35 hobby or traction boiler is \$45.

1 5230.0100 FEES.

2 Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]

3 Subp. 2. Application for renewal. A license that has
4 expired within one year of application for renewal may be
5 renewed without an examination on filing an application for
6 renewal with the Department of Labor and Industry, accompanied
7 by the fee required in this part. An application for renewal
8 received by the department more than 30 days after the
9 expiration date of the license must be accompanied by the late
10 fee in subpart 3, item F.

11 If a license holder has failed to submit an application for
12 renewal within one year of the date of the expiration of the
13 license, renewal is not allowed unless the applicant files the
14 application, pays the fee required by this part, and passes the
15 examination required by this chapter.

16 Subp. 3. Examination and license. The fees for
17 examination and license are as follows:

18 A. pipefitter journeyman, examination and license,
19 \$50;

20 B. renewal of pipefitter journeyman license, \$30;

21 C. contracting pipefitter, examination and license,
22 \$125;

23 D. renewal of contracting pipefitter license, \$110;

24 E. pipefitter contractor bond and insurance
25 processing, \$50; and

26 F. late fees:

27 (1) contractor, \$125; and

28 (2) journeyman, \$50.

29 Payment of examination and license fees must accompany the
30 application. There will be no refund of fees paid.

31 Subp. 4. Permit to construct or install power piping
32 systems. A person, firm, or corporation that constructs or
33 installs power piping systems must file an application for a
34 permit with the Department of Labor and Industry, or with a
35 municipality that is authorized by law to issue that type of
36 permit, before beginning construction or installation. The

1 department's fees for a permit to construct or install power
2 piping systems are:

3 A. filing fee (application for permit), \$25; and

4 B. inspection fee, 0.010 of the first \$1,000,000,
5 plus 0.0075 of the next \$2,000,000, plus 0.0005 of the next
6 \$47,000,000, plus 0.00025 of the amount over \$50,000,000 of the
7 cost of constructing or installing the power piping systems as
8 defined under part 5230.0260.
