- Subpart 1. to 3. [Unchanged.] 9
- Subp. 4. Legislative priorities. The board shall give 10
- 11 priority to projects located in cities, counties, or districts
- in which: 12
- the natural geologic and soil conditions are 13 Α.
- especially unsuitable for land disposal of solid waste; 14
- 15 B. and C. [Unchanged.]
- 9200.6300 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA. 16
- 17 Subpart 1. [Unchanged.]
- 18 Subp. 2. Eligible projects. Six types of projects are
- 19 eligible for grants: waste to energy; materials recovery;
- chemical, physical, or biological modifications; transfer 20
- stations; special waste streams; and waste incineration with 21
- resource recovery. Eligible projects are limited to those in 22
- which the land, buildings, and equipment are publicly owned. 23
- Subp. 3. Eligible costs. Except as provided in part 24
- 25 9200.8220 9200.6900, eligible costs under parts 9200.6050 to
- 26 9200.6800 are limited to the costs of land; waste processing
- equipment; structures necessary to house the waste processing 27
- 28 equipment; transmission facilities; appropriate and necessary
- 29 on-site utilities; landscaping; on-site roads and parking;
- structures necessary to concentrate and temporarily store solid 30
- waste before transportation to a waste processing facility; 31
- trailers, containers, and roll-off boxes necessary to transport 32
- wastes from transfer stations to a processing facility, to 33

- 3 Subp. 4. Ineligible costs. Except as provided in part
- 4 9200-8220 9200.6900, ineligible costs include any costs related
- 5 to solid waste disposal facilities and equipment, structures for
- 6 housing and maintenance of rolling stock, or any costs related
- 7 to resource recovery studies, feasibility analyses, or
- 8 preliminary design and engineering/architectural plans.

- 11 Applications for waste processing facilities grants shall
- 12 include the following supporting documentation:

- 34 9200.6600 REVIEW AND EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS.
- 35 Subpart 1. and 2. [Unchanged.]

- 1 Subp. 3. Evaluation of need for financial assistance. In
- 2 making its evaluation of the application, the board shall first
- 3 evaluate the information supplied in part 9200.6500, item C to
- 4 determine whether or not board assistance is important for
- 5 facility development. If the board determines that assistance
- 6 is not necessary important, evaluation of the application shall
- 7 cease and the application shall be returned to the applicant.
- 8 If the board determines that assistance is necessary important,
- 9 evaluation will proceed to the second stage. During the second
- 10 stage, the board shall evaluate documentation submitted under
- 11 part 9200.6500, items A, B, and D to L.
- 12 Subp. 4. Evaluation of applications. If the board
- 13 determines that the project is in need of state assistance, the
- 14 board shall evaluate the application to determine whether the
- 15 application demonstrates:

- 17 E. that for projects serving eligible jurisdictions
- 18 in only a single county, cooperation with jurisdictions in other
- 19 counties to develop the project is not needed or not feasible;

- 28 Subpart 1. Maximum grant award. Except as provided in
- 29 part 9200.8220 9200.6900, the maximum grant award is 25 percent
- 30 of the eligible capital costs of the project or \$2,000,000,
- 31 whichever is less, unless the project is a recycling project or
- 32 a project to compost or co-compost waste. A recycling project
- 33 or a project to compost or co-compost waste may receive grant
- 34 assistance up to 50 percent of the capital cost of the project
- 35 or \$2,000,000, whichever is less.

- 15 9200.8220 9200.6900 ENVIRONMENTAL TESTING GRANTS.
- 16 Subpart 1. Eligible applicants. Eligible applicants are
- 17 limited to those eligible under Minnesota Statutes, section
- 18 115A.50.
- 19 Subp. 2. Eligible projects. Eligible projects are limited
- 20 to those eligible for funding under Minnesota Statutes, section
- 21 115A.54.
- 22 Subp. 3. Eligible costs. Eligible costs under this part
- 23 are limited to the costs of tests necessary to determine the
- 24 appropriate pollution control equipment for the project or the
- 25 environmental effects of the use of any product or material
- 26 produced by the project. Tests-necessary-to-determine-the
- 27 appropriate-pollution-control-equipment-shall-be-limited-to
- 28 those-tests-needed-to-identify-pollution-control-equipment
- 29 needed-to-bring-the-facility-into-compliance-with-applicable
- 30 standards. The cost of routine environmental monitoring
- 31 required-to-comply-with-operating-permit-conditions is not
- 32 eligible for funding under this part.
- 33 Subp. 4. Information on grant application. Applications
- 34 for environmental testing grants shall include the following

- 1 information as required in the application forms supplied by the
- 2 board:
- 3 A. the name of each applicant making the grant
- 4 application;
- 5 B. the name of each political subdivision affected by
- 6 the project;
- 7 C. the name, qualifications, and address of the
- 8 project manager;
- 9 D. the name, qualifications, and address of the
- 10 facility operator;
- 11 E. the total costs of testing eligible for funding
- 12 under this part as documented by a proposal from a testing
- 13 laboratory to perform the testing setting out the costs of the
- 14 testing that will be performed;
- 15 F. the amount of grant funding requested;
- G. the type of waste processing facility for which
- 17 the application is being submitted, and the type of testing that
- 18 is needed for the facility; and
- 19 H. a work plan including a detailed description of
- 20 the type of testing that will be performed, who will be
- 21 performing the testing, and a time schedule for the testing. #t
- 22 is-recommended-that Applicants must contact the Pollution
- 23 Control Agency or-other-regulatory-agency before developing a
- 24 test-proposal work plan to receive assistance in determining the
- 25 tests that are needed.
- Subp. 5. Review and approval of applications. The chair
- 27 shall review each application for funding under this part for
- 28 eligibility and completeness. When the chair has determined
- 29 that the applicant is eligible and that the application is
- 30 complete, the chair shall forward the application to the
- 31 Pollution Control Agency, or other appropriate regulatory
- 32 agencies, for review.
- 33 Subp. 6. Board determination. The board shall evaluate
- 34 the application to determine if the proposed testing is
- 35 necessary to determine the appropriate pollution control
- 36 equipment for the project or the environmental effects of the

- 1 use of any product or material produced by the project. In
- 2 making this determination, the board shall consider the comments
- 3 of the Pollution Control Agency or other regulatory agency that
- 4 has reviewed the application. If the board determines that the
- 5 proposed testing is necessary, the board shall determine the
- 6 amount to be awarded and authorize the chair to enter into an
- 7 agreement with the applicant governing disbursement of funds.
- 8 Subp. 7. Funding level. The board shall fund 100 percent
- 9 of the cost of testing under this part. The maximum grant award
- 10 per project shall be limited to \$100,000 \$200,000. Grants shall
- ll not be awarded to cover any cost associated with tasks performed
- 12 before the grant award or after the expiration of the grant
- 13 agreement.

- 15 incorporate by reference the final grant application submitted
- 16 to the board under this part; provide that any cost overruns
- 17 incurred by the testing program shall be the sole responsibility
- 18 of the recipient; provide that the board will not accept
- 19 amendments requesting that additional funds be awarded to the
- 20 recipient unless the board determines that additional testing is
- 21 necessary; and require that the recipient make the information
- 22 developed as a result of the testing available to the state and
- 23 other persons who request the information.
