- 7 8870.0100 DEFINITIONS.
- 8 Subpart 1. Scope. The terms used in this chapter have the
- 9 meanings given them in this part.
- 10 Subp. 2. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the
- 11 commissioner of transportation.
- 12 Subp. 3. Department. "Department" means the Department of
- 13 Transportation.
- 14 Subp. 4. Hazardous waste. "Hazardous waste" means waste
- 15 considered hazardous under Minnesota Statutes, section 116.06,
- 16 subdivision 13.
- 17 Subp. 5. Person. "Person" has the meaning given it in
- 18 Minnesota Statutes, section 221.011, subdivision 6.
- 19 Subp. 6. Trailer. "Trailer" includes a semitrailer and
- 20 any other cargo-carrying unit.
- 21 Subp. 7. Transport. "Transport" means to move hazardous
- 22 waste by motor vehicle over a public highway.
- Subp. 8. Vehicle. "Vehicle" has the meaning given it in
- 24 Minnesota Statutes, section 221.011, subdivision 3.
- 25 8870.0200 SCOPE.
- 26 Subpart 1. License required. Parts 8870.0100 to 8870.1100
- 27 apply to the transportation of hazardous waste on a public
- 28 highway. Except as provided in subpart 2, no person shall
- 29 transport a hazardous waste without a license.
- 30 Subpart 2. Exceptions. The following hazardous wastes may
- 31 be transported without a hazardous waste transporter license:
- A. exempt wastes described in part 7045.0120;
- B. farm pesticide wastes exempt under parts 7045.0213
- 34 and 7045.0304 that are disposed of in a manner consistent with
- 35 the disposal instructions on the pesticide label;

- C. wastes identified under part 7045.0131, subpart 6,
- 2 items A and B, and exempted under part 7045.0133;
- D. industrial ethyl alcohol that is reclaimed;
- 4 E. used batteries returned to a manufacturer for
- 5 regeneration;
- F. scrap metal that exhibits a hazardous
- 7 characteristic but is being recycled;
- 8 G. used oil that does not contain a waste listed
- 9 under part 7045.0135, and that-does-not-exhibit-a-hazardous
- 10 characteristic-described-in-part-7045:01317 that is to be
- ll recycled; and
- 12 H. spent lead-acid batteries that are being reclaimed.
- 13 8870.0300 HAZARDOUS WASTE TRANSPORTER LICENSE APPLICATION.
- 14 Subpart 1. Application procedure. An applicant for a
- 15 license shall submit to the commissioner:
- A. the information described in this part;
- B. the fees described in Laws of Minnesota 1987,
- 18 chapter 393, article 1, section 1, subdivision 1, paragraph (b);
- 19 and
- 20 C. an insurance certificate under Minnesota Statutes,
- 21 section 221.141.
- 22 Subp. 2. Information required. The applicant shall submit
- 23 the following information on a form prescribed by the
- 24 commissioner:
- A. the applicant's name, including an assumed or
- 26 fictitious name used by the applicant in doing business;
- B. the location from which applicant's transportation
- 28 business is conducted;
- 29 C. the addresses of applicant's Minnesota terminals,
- 30 if any;
- D. the address of applicant's principal place of
- 32 business;
- 33 E. the state where applicant's business is
- 34 incorporated;
- F. the applicant's mailing address;

- G. if the applicant is a foreign corporation
- 2 authorized to transact business in Minnesota, the name and
- 3 address of its registered agent for-service-of-process;-if-any;
- 4 H. the names of corporate officers, general partners,
- 5 associates, or other owners of applicant's business;
- 6 I. the name and phone number of a person who can
- 7 answer questions about the applicant's transportation business;
- 8 J. the Environmental Protection Agency identification
- 9 number of the applicant;
- 10 K. the Interstate Commerce Commission MC number of
- 11 the applicant, if any;
- 12 L. the intrastate permit or certificate number of the
- 13 applicant, if any;
- M. whether the applicant's business is a corporation,
- 15 partnership, association, or sole proprietorship;
- N. whether the transporter is also a generator,
- 17 recycler, or a treatment, storage, or disposal facility as
- 18 defined in chapter 7045, or a combination of them;
- 0. other states in which the applicant has authority
- 20 to transport hazardous wastes; and
- P. a description of any conviction, plea of guilty,
- 22 or payment of a civil or criminal fine for violating a law,
- 23 ordinance, or regulation related to transporting hazardous waste.
- Subp. 3. Fee. The license fee is \$500.
- Subp. 4. Insurance requirements. The applicant shall file
- 26 a certificate of insurance with the commissioner. This
- 27 certificate must state that the applicant's policy meets federal
- 28 public liability requirements prescribed in Code of Federal
- 29 Regulations, title 49, part 387.
- 30 8870.0400 HAZARDOUS WASTE TRANSPORTER LICENSE.
- 31 Subpart 1. Issuance of license. The commissioner shall
- 32 issue a license to an applicant who meets the requirements of
- 33 part 8870.0300. The license must be numbered and bear an
- 34 effective date.
- 35 Subp. 2. Maintenance of license. The license must be

- 1 maintained at the licensee's principal place of business and,
- 2 upon request, must be available for inspection by the
- 3 commissioner or law enforcement officer.
- 4 Subp. 3. Duration. The license expires three years from
- 5 its effective date.
- 6 Subp. 4. Transferability. A license may not be
- 7 transferred to another person.
- 8 Subp. 5. Records. The commissioner shall keep a record of
- 9 each hazardous waste transporter license issued.
- 10 8870.0500 VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION DECAL REQUIRED.
- 11 A single-unit vehicle and each trailer used to transport
- 12 hazardous waste must bear one valid and readily legible decal.
- 13 The decal must be kept clean and legible.
- 14 8870.0600 VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION DECAL APPLICATION.
- 15 Subpart 1. Information required. An applicant for a decal
- 16 shall submit the following information on a form prescribed by
- 17 the commissioner:
- A. the applicant's name, including an assumed or
- 19 fictitious name used by the applicant in doing business, mailing
- 20 address, and telephone number;
- 21 B. the applicant's Minnesota hazardous waste
- 22 transporter license number;
- C. the name, address, and telephone number of a
- 24 person who can answer questions about the applicant's
- 25 transportation business;
- D. if the licensee does not own the vehicle, the name
- 27 and address of the owner;
- 28 E. the state and license <u>plate</u> number of vehicle
- 29 registration;
- F. the vehicle identification number;
- 31 G. the vehicle year and make; and
- 32 H. a description of the type of vehicle or vehicle
- 33 combination.
- 34 Subp. 2. Fees. An applicant shall pay a fee of \$25 for
- 35 each decal.

- 1 8870.0700 VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION DECAL.
- 2 Subpart 1. Issuance. The commissioner shall issue a
- 3 vehicle identification decal for each vehicle for which vehicle
- 4 identification information is provided in an application.
- 5 Subp. 2. Description. Vehicle identification decals must
- 6 be-serially-numbered-and bear an identifying number and the
- 7 month and year of expiration and the words "hazardous waste
- 8 transporter."
- 9 Subp. 3. Placement. The decal must be affixed on the side
- 10 of the vehicle opposite the driver and within three feet of the
- 11 front of each trailer or the cargo part of the single-unit
- 12 vehicle.
- 13 Subp. 4. Duration. The decal expires one year from the
- 14 effective date of the decal or upon expiration of the person's
- 15 hazardous waste transporter license, whichever occurs first.
- 16 Subp. 5. Transferability. A vehicle identification decal
- 17 may not be transferred to another vehicle.
- 18 Subp. 6. Department record. The commissioner shall keep a
- 19 record of each vehicle identification decal issued.
- 20 8870.0800 ACKNOWLEDGMENT.
- 21 Subpart 1. Signature required. An application for a
- 22 hazardous waste transporter license or for a vehicle
- 23 identification decal must be signed by a corporate officer,
- 24 general partner, or sole proprietor. An application may not be
- 25 signed by an agent or attorney.
- Subp. 2. Certification. An applicant for a hazardous
- 27 waste transporter license or vehicle identification decal shall
- 28 sign the following statement: "I understand that the
- 29 transportation of hazardous waste under the license or decal for
- 30 which I am applying is subject to the Hazardous Waste
- 31 Transporter License Law, Laws of Minnesota 1987, chapter 393,
- 32 article 1; Minnesota Statutes, section 221.033; the federal
- 33 motor carrier safety regulations; and the Minnesota Pollution
- 34 Control Agency rules applicable to hazardous waste
- 35 transportation. I understand and agree to comply with those

- l laws, rules, and regulations."
- Subp. 3. Statement of truth and accuracy. An applicant
- 3 for a hazardous waste transporter license or vehicle
- 4 identification decal shall sign the following statement: "The
- 5 above information is, to the best of my knowledge, complete,
- 6 truthful, and accurate."
- 7 Subp. 4. Signature notarized. The signatures of corporate
- 8 officers and general partners must be notarized.
- 9 8870.0900 TRAINING.
- 10 Subpart 1. Requirement. The applicant or licensee shall
- ll instruct employees about the regulations in Code of Federal
- 12 Regulations, title 49, parts 170 to 179.
- Subp. 2. Certification. The applicant or licensee must
- 14 sign the following statement: "I have complied with the
- 15 requirement of Code of Federal Regulations, title 49, section
- 16 177.800, and have instructed my employees about the regulations
- 17 in Code of Federal Regulations, title 49, parts 170 to 179."
- 18 8870.1000 REPORTING REOUIREMENTS.
- 19 Subpart 1. Information change. The licensee shall report
- 20 to the commissioner within ten days any change in the following
- 21 information:
- A. the licensee's name, including an assumed or
- 23 fictitious name used by the applicant in doing business;
- B. the licensee's physical business location;
- 25 C. the licensee's mailing address; or
- D. the name and telephone number of a person who can
- 27 answer questions about the applicant's transportation business.
- Subp. 2. Accident report. Within 30 days after the
- 29 occurrence, the licensee shall report to the commissioner, on a
- 30 form prescribed by the commissioner, an accident involving a
- 31 vehicle transporting hazardous waste that results in:
- 32 A. the death of a human being;
- B. bodily injury to a person who, as a result of the
- 34 injury, immediately receives medical treatment away from the
- 35 scene of the accident; or

- C. total damage to all property aggregating \$4,400 or
- 2 more based on actual costs or reliable estimates.
- 3 Subp. 3. Exceptions. An accident does not include:
- 4 A. an occurrence involving only entering and leaving
- 5 a stationary motor vehicle; and
- 6 B. an occurrence involving only the loading or
- 7 unloading of cargo.
- 8 Subp. 4. Report of hazardous waste incident. A licensee
- 9 must report hazardous waste incidents as required by Minnesota
- 10 Statutes, section 221.034, and Code of Federal Regulations,
- 11 title 49, sections 171.15 and 171.16.
- 12 Subp. 5. Grounds for suspension, revocation. Failure to
- 13 comply with the requirements in this part is grounds for
- 14 suspension or revocation of a license.
- 15 8870.1100 RENEWAL PROCEDURE.
- Renewal applications must be made according to the
- 17 procedure described in part 8870.0300 for new applications.
