3 Adopted Permanent Rule Relating to Licenses; Expiration and Fees

6 3800.1000 LICENSES; EXPIRATION AND FEES.

7 Subpart 1. Expiration. Except as otherwise provided in  
8 this part, all licenses issued or renewed under this part expire  
9 two years from the date of issuance or renewal. All Class "A"  
10 master, Class "B" master, and master elevator constructor  
11 licenses issued or renewed prior to March 1, 1989, expire on  
12 March 1, 1989. Class "A" master, Class "B" master, and master  
13 elevator constructor licenses issued or renewed on or after  
14 March 1, 1989, expire March 1 of the next odd-numbered year  
15 after issuance or renewal. Electrical contractor licenses  
16 issued or renewed expire March 1 of each even-numbered year  
17 after issuance or renewal. Alarm and communication contractor  
18 licenses expire July 1 of each odd-numbered year after issuance  
19 or renewal.

20 Subp. 2. Examination, issuance, and renewal fees. The  
21 following fees shall be payable for examination, issuance, and  
22 renewal:

23 A. For examination for each class of license, \$25.

24 B. For issuance of original license and renewal:

25 (1) Class "A" master and master elevator  
26 constructor, \$35 a year;

27 (2) Class "B" master, \$20 a year;

28 (3) Class "A" journeyman, Class "B" journeyman,  
29 Class "A" or "B" installer, elevator constructor, maintenance,  
30 lineman, or special electrician, \$10 a year; and

31 (4) Electrical contractor and alarm and  
32 communication contractor, \$75 a year.

33 Subp. 3. Prorating fees. If a new Class "A" master or  
34 master elevator constructor license is issued in accordance with  
35 subpart 1 for less than two years, the fee for the license shall

1 be prorated on a quarterly basis. The electrical contractor's  
2 and alarm and communication contractor's license fee shall be  
3 prorated on a quarterly basis for each quarter or part of a  
4 quarter that the license is issued in accordance with subpart 1.

5 Subp. 4. Refunds. A license fee may not be refunded after  
6 a license is issued or renewed. However, if the fee paid for a  
7 license was not prorated in accordance with subpart 3, the  
8 amount of the overpayment shall be refunded.

9 Subp. 5. Reissuance fee. Any electrical contractor or  
10 alarm and communication contractor who seeks reissuance of his  
11 or her license after it has been revoked or suspended pursuant  
12 to part 3800.0800 of the Board of Electricity shall submit a  
13 reissuance fee of \$100 before the license is reinstated.

14 Subp. 6. Duplicate license fee. The fee for the issuance  
15 of each duplicate license is \$3.
