- A. address the manner in which the multicultural and 32
- gender fair concepts in subpart 1, items A, B, and C are to be 33
- incorporated into the curriculum goals, learner outcomes, and 34

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evaluation processes established in the district; 35

- B. determine the extent to which the district
- 2 curriculum advisory committee established by Minnesota Statutes,
- 3 section 126.666, subdivision $\frac{3}{2}$, will be involved in
- 4 implementing this part;
- 5 C. include evidence of substantive involvement by
- 6 women, persons of color, and handicapped persons in the
- 7 development of the plan. In communities with no persons of
- 8 color, the district shall use resource people available in the
- 9 region, state, or nation whenever the plan is developed,
- 10 reviewed, or revised;
- 11 D. include specific goals, objectives, and
- 12 implementation timelines for the curriculum processes, content,
- 13 and materials needed for each of the areas in subpart 1;
- 14 E. include procedures for systematic monitoring and
- 15 evaluation of the plan; and
- 16 F. include a description of the program planned to
- 17 provide inservice training for all staff in the areas related to
- 18 subpart 1, items A, B, and C, and subpart 2, items D and E.
- 19 Subp. 3. Filing, reports, review, and revision.
- 20 A. The current plan must be on file in the
- 21 administrative offices of the district and with the commissioner
- 22 of education.
- B. The district shall submit status reports on
- 24 implementing the plan as requested by the commissioner.
- 25 C. The current plan must be reviewed at least every
- 26 six years and be revised as necessary.

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- 28 EFFECTIVE DATE. Minnesota Rules, part 3500.0550, is
- 29 effective June 1, 1990. The plan required to be adopted under
- 30 subpart 1 must be adopted before that date and must be in effect
- 31 and on file in the district and with the commissioner by that
- 32 date.
